ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Order No. R-2162, Pan American Petroleum Corporation has made application to the Commission on February 5, 1965, for permission to expand its Totah Gallup Pressure Maintenance Project No. 1 in the Totah-Gallup Oil Pool, San Juan County, New Mexico.

NOW, on this 25th day of February, 1965, the Secretary-Director finds:

1. That application has been filed in due form.
2. That satisfactory information has been provided that all offset operators have been duly notified of the application.
3. That no objection has been received within the waiting period as prescribed by Order No. R-2162.
4. That the proposed injection well is eligible for conversion to water injection under the terms of Order No. R-2162.
5. That the proposed expansion of the above-referenced pressure maintenance project will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
6. That the application should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant, Pan American Petroleum Corporation, be and the same is hereby authorized to inject water into the Gallup formation through the following described well for purposes of pressure maintenance, to wit:

Navajo "H" Well No. 12 located in the SW/4 NW/4 of Section 14, Township 29 North, Range 14 West, NMPM.

Done at Santa Fe, New Mexico, on the day and year hereinabove designated.


In accordance with Rule 12 of Order No. R-2162, which granted Pan American Petroleum Corporation authority to institute pressure maintenance projects in the Totah Gallup Pool, San Juan County, New Mexico, Pan American requests Administrative approval to convert one additional well, Navajo "H" Well No. 12, in our Totah Gallup Pressure Maintenance Project No. 1 to injection service. Attached is a plat showing the proposed injection well, active water injection wells, and all wells within Project Area No. 1. The plat also shows two wells of an offset operator which have been abandoned.

Also attached is a log showing the perforated intervals, and a schematic drawing of the proposed new injection well which fully describes the casing, tubing, perforated intervals and depth. Although the only offset operator in the Totah Gallup Pool, Sunray DX Oil Company, has abandoned their wells which offset the Navajo "H" lease, we are advising them of this change by a copy of this letter.

Conversion of Navajo "H" Well No. 12 to injection service will be in keeping with our active injection pattern. Well No. 12 will serve as the only injection well on the northern part of the lease and is proposed for conversion to assure maximum recovery from the project.
