THE APPLICATION OF CONTINENTAL OIL  
COMPANY FOR A SALT WATER DISPOSAL  
WELL.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER  
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 701 (c) Continental Oil Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on June 17, 1964, for permission to recompleate for salt water disposal its Anderson Ranch Unit Well No. 16 located in Unit T of Section 2, Township 16 South, Range 32 East, Anderson Ranch Field, Lea County, New Mexico.

The Secretary-Director Finds:

(1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 701 (C) of the Commission Rules and Regulations;

(2) That waivers of objection have been received from offset operators to the well, the lessee from the State of New Mexico of the surface rights under Section 2, and from the New Mexico State Engineer office.

(3) That the applicant has presented satisfactory evidence that all requirements prescribed in Rule 701 (C) will be met.


IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Continental Oil Company, is hereby authorized to complete its Anderson Ranch Unit Well No. 16 located in Unit T of Section 2, Township 16 South, Range 32 East, Anderson Ranch Field, Lea County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the injection of salt water for disposal purposes into the Lower Wolfcamp formation through the open hole interval from 9919 feet to approximately 10,170 feet; injection to be down 2-7/8 inch tubing set in a packer at approximately 9910 feet, provided however, that by July 20, 1964, the tubing string through which injection is made must be internally plastic coated.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained by the Commission for such further order or orders as may seem necessary or convenient for the prevention of waste and/or protection of correlative rights; upon failure of applicant to comply with any requirement of this order, after notice and hearing the Commission may terminate the authority hereby granted in the interests of conservation. That applicant shall submit monthly reports of its disposal operation in accordance with Rules 704 and 1119 of the Commission Rules and Regulations.
