DESCRIPTION: W/2 of Section 24

Township 27 North, Range 10 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico

The above-named company is hereby authorized to commingle Fulcher Kutz-Pictured Cliffs (Gas – 77200) and Basin-Dakota (Prorated Gas – 71599) Pool production from the above mentioned lease and to determine production from each pool by separately metering the production from the J. C. Gordon "D" No. 5 and determining the J. C. Gordon "B" No. 1 production by the subtraction method. Oil production will not be commingled. Fuel gas usage will be allocated equally between the two wells.

NOTE: This installation shall be installed and operated in accordance with the applicable provisions of Rule 303 of the Division Rules and Regulations and the Division "Manual for the Installation and Operation of Commingling Facilities." It is the responsibility of the producer to notify the transporter of this commingling authority.

REMARKS: The commingled natural gas production shall be delivered to a gas sales meter located in Unit C of Section 24, Township 27 North, Range 10 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico.

FURTHER: The operator shall notify the Aztec District Office of the Division upon implementation of commingling operations.
