In the past six months a number of wells have been drilled on these properties in which they had overriding royalties, one well Burch C #19 was drilled on a lease where no tank battery and facilities were available. This well is located in Section 18 Twp. 17 South Rge. 30 East, Eddy County, New Mexico.

General American Oil Company of Texas is seeking to obtain administrative approval for off lease storage for production from the Burch C lease. The proposed off lease storage site would be located on the Kaelly C lease, in which Mr. Dexter and Mr. Berry also owned royalty interest. A plat is attached showing the proposed site and showing both leases involved outlined in yellow.

Reasons for seeking off lease storage are: (1) A pipeline connection for the oil is available at the Kaelly C site which will save 20 cents per barrel for both the operator and the royalty owner if oil does not have to be trucked. (2) A gas sales connection is available so gas can be sold, if the battery is not located at this site gas would probably be flared as the amount of gas would not be sufficient to build a pipeline for one well, (3) Disposition of produced water will be much easier having the batteries located at a central location.

We are sending you this letter in compliance with New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission Rule 309-C a copy of this Rule is attached. As you will note in section (5) the rule requires that all owners be contacted by registered or Certified mail.
