P Reference is made to your application dated December 14, 1966,
for administrative approval of an exception to Rule 303 (a) of the
Commission Rules and Regulations to permit the commingling of Blin-
bry, Drinkard, and Paddock production on your Rollon Brunson Lease
Y comprising the W/2 NE/4 of Section 10, Township 22 South, Range 37
East, Lea County, New Mexico, allocating the production to each of
the pools on the basis of periodic well tests. It is our under-
standing that the production from each of the three pools on said
lease is of marginal nature.

By the authority vested in me under the provisions of Rule 303
(b) of the Commission Rules and Regulations, you are hereby autho-
rized to commingle the production from the aforesaid pools on said
lease in the above-described manner. Provided however, that the
installation shall be operated in accordance with the provisions
of the Commission "Manual for the Installation and Operation of
Commingling Facilities," and provided further, that you shall
notify the Commission at such time as any well in any of the
aforesaid pools is capable of top allowable production.
