Gentlemen:

Continental Oil Company hereby requests authority to commingle the Dakor oil production with the Pennsylvanian-Mississippian oil production in the Table Mess Field.

Oil production from the Dakota reservoir at Table Mesa continues to decline despite our efforts to arrest the decline. The water out is in excess of 98 percent with oil production of only 40 BPD. Profitability of operating the Dakota properties is quite marginal at this time with operating costs for the first nine months of 1966 at 28.20 per revenue dollar. Dakota production is currently being treated and shipped to the pipeline through a separate system. We propose to commingle the Dakota production with the Pennsylvanian and Mississippian production at the same battery before shipment to the pipeline. Commingling of the production will result in the elimination of maintenance for the Dakota ACT; and a reduced investment in these properties. The ultimate result will be a lower operating cost and a lower economic limit which will mean more ultimate oil recovery.

We propose to commingle the Dakota oil production with the Pennsylvanian-Mississippian at the run tank ahead of the ACT. Dakota production will be measured with a barrel dump meter ahead of the run tank thereby assuring accurate allocation of the Dakota oil production. No changes will be made in either well test system which will permit accurate allocation of oil production to the producing wells in the three formations.

Royalty from all three formations is owned exclusively by the Navaje Tribe. Continental Gil Company is the operator owning 50% working interest in the Dakota formation and 75% working interest in the Pennsylvanian and Mississippian formations. The remaining working interest is owned by the Holly Gil Company.




