Our applications on all five wells showed that the wells were dually completed in the Basin Dakota and Blanco Mesaverde Fields. Actually only the Jicarilla "C" No. 4 is completed in these two fields. The other four wells are dually completed in the Basin Dakota and Tapacito Gallup Fields. Our applications to you were in error but our applications for U.S.G.S. approval showed the proper fields. We are attaching a copy of the approvals from the U.S.G.S..
