Gentlemen:

With this letter and enclosed documents we are applying for an exception to Rule 303(a) of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission Rules and Regulations. We propose to commingle the Blinebry and San Andres on our State "A" Lease located in the S/2 NE/4 of Section 32, Township 18 South, Range 38 East, Hobbs Field, Lea County, New Mexico. Since each of the zones will have top allowable wells, we propose to continuously meter and sample the Blinebry separately as is prescribed by the subtraction method of commingling. Since both zones are sour priced with an API gravity of 33° to 35°, we expect no change in revenue as a result of commingling.





## Gentlemen:

Your request for permission to commingle the Blinebry and San Andres production from your State "A" lease in the Hobbs Field, Lea County, New Mexico is granted.
