Dear Mr. Catanach:

Meridian Oil Company and Southland Royalty Company respectfully submit a formal request to combine production on the above captioned leases. The Federal "21" battery is currently handling the Federal "21" wells, 1,2,3, & 4. The flowline to the Federal "21" battery is shorter than a flowline to the Federal MA battery, and will thus save us money to lay. The gravity will be similar to either battery's production. The value of the commingled production will be the same as the values of the production from each common source. Presently, the Federal "21" Lease is under Surface Commingling Order PC-769, thus we are asking to amend this to a lease commingling to add the Federal MA #9.

We are also requesting approval for off-lease storage for the Federal MA #9 to the Federal "21" Lease. The Federal MA #9 (currently drilling) could produce up to 445 BOPD from the Wolfcamp (top allowable). The existing Federal MA battery is not capable of handling this volume increase, however, the Federal "21" battery is capable as it is currently underutilized. The Federal "21" battery is also closer to the Federal MA #9. Both leases are Federal and 100% Meridian Oil owned. In granting this request, there is no indication of the Federal system being affected in any manner. The production will be allocated monthly based on well tests through the three phase separator (see schematic).






FEDERAL MA No. 9 - FLOWLINE


