Enclosed are copies of letters sent to Nearburg Exploration Company, L.L.C and Jeffrey M. Johnston, attorney for Michael and Linda Harton, notifying them that the above matter has been continued until April 1, 2004 to allow interested parties to appear and show cause why an order should not be issued to Saba Energy of Texas, Inc. ("Saba"). to properly plug six wells.

Notice is being sent to Nearburg Exploration Company, L.L.C. because the State Land Office has informed us that Nearburg has acquired the lease on which the two San Simon 5 State wells are located. To notify Nearburg, I used both addresses listed on the New Mexico Public Regulatory Commission website.

Notice is being sent to Mr. Johnston because he is the attorney for Michael and Linda Harton. Mr. Bruce has alleged that the Hartons are engaged in litigation with Saba regarding the leases on which some or all of the remaining wells are located. I used the address listed in the New Mexico Bar Directory for Mr. Johnston.

Please note that Exhibits 1 and 2 introduced by Saba Energy of Texas, Inc. at the February 19 hearing identify 21 other defendants, 11 cross-plaintiffs and 7 cross-defendants in the litigation. I do not plan to notify any of those parties unless I receive further instruction from the hearing examiner.

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Dear Ms. MacQuesten and Mr. Bruce:

Our law firm represents Michael and Linda Harton with regard to the Harton State #1 and the Fern Guye #1 wells in Lea County, New Mexico, which are two of the subject wells in the referenced application.

We are unable to attend the hearing for the referenced case on April 1, 2004, because of a hearing scheduled in Lovington. New Mexico, regarding litigation pending which involves the Harton State #1 Well. That matter is No. CV-2001-249-MC, Michael Harton, et al. v. Greka Energy Corporation, et al. in the Fifth Judicial District Court, I.ea County, New Mexico.

Our clients have asked that we request that until the pending litigation is completed, the status of the Harton State #1 and the Fern Guye #1 wells be changed to temporarily abandoned instead of plugged and abandoned. Our engineering experts believe both wells are capable of production in paying quantities, and, therefore, it would be committing economic waste to plug them at this time.
