WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 1 2 10:42 a.m.: 3 EXAMINER JONES: Okay, let's go back on the 4 record and call Case 13,354, Application of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division for a compliance order, Lea 5 County, New Mexico. 6 7 Call for appearances. 8 MS. MacQUESTEN: Gail MacQuesten, Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department, appearing for 9 the Oil Conservation Division. I have one witness, Chris 10 Williams, who will be appearing by telephone. 11 EXAMINER JONES: Any other witnesses? 12 MS. MacQUESTEN: 13 No. EXAMINER JONES: Or appearances? If not, will 14 the witness please stand to be sworn? 15 (Thereupon, the witness was sworn.) 16 MS. MacQUESTEN: If I may briefly explain what 17 we're asking for in this case, this is a plugging case for 18 a single well. The well is in violation of Rule 201 19 20 because it has been inactive for at least ten years, it is 21 not plugged and abandoned, and it was not placed on 22 temporary abandonment status pursuant to Rule 203. 23 We anticipate that the State will have to plug 24 this well because we have been unable to contact the 25 operator.

We are asking for an order pursuant to the Oil and Gas Act, Section 70-2-14.B, and OCD Rule 101.M, requiring the operator to bring the well into compliance with 201 within 30 days by plugging, placing the well on temporary abandonment status or returning it to beneficial use.

We also ask that the order authorize the Division to plug the well if the operator fails to comply, and authorizing the Division to forfeit the applicable financial assurances.

There's one complication in this case. The operator of record is Tahoe Energy, Inc. We have an approved C-104 making Tahoe Energy, Inc., the operator, but when it posted the bond it made a mistake. The owner/president of Tahoe put his own name on the bond as a principal, as an individual. It's styled Kenneth A. Freeman, doing business as Tahoe Energy, Inc. In other words, he treated it as a sole proprietorship when, in fact, it was a corporation.

We probably should have rejected the bond and told him to fill it out correctly, but instead the OCD accepted the bond and treated it as a bond for Tahoe Energy. Because Mr. Freeman's name is on the bond, as well as Tahoe Energy, Inc., and we are asking for authority to forfeit that bond, I treated him as a party to this action.

We put him in the caption and sent notice to the best available address we had for him.

There should be an evidence packet in front of you. Exhibit 1 is our affidavit of notice, showing notice to the available addresses we have for Tahoe Energy, for Mr. Freeman and for the surety. We received a return receipt from the surety, but our letters to Tahoe Energy and Mr. Freeman were returned.

We asked for a continuance in this case -originally it was scheduled on an earlier docket -- to
determine if we had the correct address for Mr. Freeman.
We were able to ascertain that it was the best available
address, and we made efforts to contact him by telephone,
but we were not able to get a response from him.

Because we couldn't reach Tahoe Energy or Mr. Freeman, we also provided you with proof of publication in the county paper, the Lovington Daily Leader. That's also part of Exhibit 1.

Exhibit 2 is an affidavit from Jane Prouty showing that we have no reported production from this well for over 20 years.

And Exhibit 3 is an affidavit from Dorothy Phillips showing the financial assurance information.

And with that, I would like to call Chris Williams as my witness.

Is this the most recent document in the well file 1 Q. for the Brownlee Number 1? 2 3 A. Yes. 4 Q. And who is shown as the operator? 5 A. Tahoe Energy, Incorporated. All right. Does this document show a change in 6 Q. 7 operator? 8 A. Right, from Tahoe Oil and Cattle Company to Tahoe Energy, Incorporated. 9 All right. Who signed this change-of-operator 10 Q. form? 11 K.A. Freeman. 12 A. And in what capacity? 13 Q. President. 14 Α. And what was the date on that? 15 Q. December 1st, 1987. 16 Α. All right, that's --17 Q. -- the date it was signed by him. 18 A. All right, thank you. If you could take a look 19 at what's been marked as Exhibit Number 6, is this the 20 21 second most recent document in the well file for the 22 Brownlee Number 1? 23 Α. Yes, it is. And what is the date on this document? 24 Q. 25 A. April 27th, 1981.

1 Q. All right. And this was when Tahoe Oil and 2 Cattle Company was the operator? Right. 3 Α. And who signed this document? 4 Q. 5 It was signed by K.A. Freeman, owner. A. Okay. So Mr. Freeman signed as owner of Tahoe 6 Q. 7 Oil and Cattle Company and then later signed as president of Tahoe Energy, Inc.? 8 Right, correct. 9 Α. In your review of the well file, was there any 10 Q. indication that this well has been placed on temporary 11 abandonment status? 12 Α. No. 13 Would you please look at Exhibit Number 7? 14 Q. Okay, the -- Yeah, Exhibit Number 7 is a plugging 15 16 procedure. For this well? 17 0. 18 Α. Yes. 19 Q. Have you reviewed this plugging procedure, and do 20 you approve it? 21 Α. Yes. 22 MS. MacQUESTEN: I have no more questions of this 23 witness. 24 EXAMINER JONES: Okay, we've got Exhibits 1 25 through 6, we'll -- 1 through 7.
