Page 2 (9:03 a.m.) 1 2 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: Good morning. Happy 3 new year. 4 This is the meeting of the New Mexico Oil 5 Conservation Commission. My name is David Catanach, 6 Chairman of the Commission. The time is approximately 7 9:03 a.m. Today's date is January 4th, 2017. This meeting is being conducted in Porter Hall within the 8 9 Wendell Chino State Building. At this time I'll take roll. 10 Will the Commissioners please introduce 11 themselves for the record? 12 COMMISSIONER PADILLA: Patrick Padilla, 13 14 designee to the New Mexico Commissioner of Public Lands. 15 COMMISSIONER BALCH: Robert Balch, designee 16 of the Secretary of Energy and Minerals. 17 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: Thank you, Commissioners. 18 Also present today is Mr. Gabriel Wade, who 19 will at least sit in for the first case, I believe, the 20 Caza case. He will be sitting in as the Commission 21 22 attorney. 23 Also present today is Ms. Florene Davidson, 24 who we sorely missed while she was out, and we welcome 25 her back.

Page 3 Thank you. 1 MS. DAVIDSON: 2 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: Commissioners, in your packet, you should have an agenda for today's meeting. 3 4 If you've reviewed the agenda, do I hear a motion and a second to adopt the agenda? 5 6 COMMISSIONER BALCH: I reviewed the agenda, and I would move to adopt it. 7 COMMISSIONER PADILLA: And I second that. 8 9 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: All those in favor? 10 (Ayes are unanimous.) CHAIRMAN CATANACH: Motion to adopt today's 11 12 agenda is passed. Also in your packet are the draft minutes 13 from the December 5th, 2016 Commission meeting. 14 15 Commissioners, do you have any changes to the minutes, and if not, is there a motion and a second 16 17 to adopt the minutes? COMMISSIONER PADILLA: I don't have any 18 changes, and I would move to adopt the minutes. 19 20 COMMISSIONER BALCH: I would second. CHAIRMAN CATANACH: All in favor? 21 (Ayes are unanimous.) 22 23 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: The next order of 24 business this morning is the review and adoption of the Annual Resolution setting forth reasonable notice 25

Page 4 standards for Commission Public Meetings. I believe if 1 2 we could get Mr. Brancard, who is in the audience and is the general counsel and the Commission attorney, to 3 4 maybe give a brief summary of what this is and why we 5 need to do it. MR. BRANCARD: 6 Thank you, Mr. Chairman, the 7 Commission. 8 The New Mexico Open Meetings Act requires 9 you every year to adopt a resolution providing how you 10 will provide reasonable notice of your meetings. Certain types of notice and certain items like the 11 agenda are provided, but specifically in the Open 12 Meetings Act in terms of actually how you do notice, 13 that's up to each Commission. This Commission has had 14 sort of the same version of this resolution every year 15 for years and have just adopted new versions of it. 16 17 This year we took a harder look at the resolution with the goal of trying to make it fit how 18 the Commission actually does its business. 19 So you'll see that we do -- what we normally do is we list the 20 21 proposed monthly meetings that the Commission will have, 22 its regular meetings. As you're aware, as the year goes 23 on, conflicts happen, changes happen, and you will 24 change the dates of those meetings. So we've provided 25 for that in this revised resolution, saying that these

are the dates that we tentatively plan to have monthly meetings. If the Commission decides to change the date, move it forward a day or two or back, that's fine, as long as you meet the notice requirements for a regular meeting that are in the Open Meetings Act. So that gives you the flexibility that you normally use anyway in doing your regular meetings.

One of the other changes in there is an 8 9 issue that constantly comes up, which is continuation of meetings. And when that is required for notice, there 10 is actually specific language in the Open Meetings Act 11 governing that, and we took that language out of the 12 Open Meetings Act and put that in there. 13 The Commission follows that practice normally, but that's something 14 that happens a lot. If a hearing goes beyond a day or 15 needs to go to a later date, what notice do you provide? 16 And remember, this notice is the notice for 17 a Commission meeting. Okay? And so one of the issues 18 is that you have separate regulations for adjudications 19 and rulemaking that have all separate notice 20 requirements for those types of hearings. Okay? 21 And so what Florene has to do often is to sort of merge. 22 Okay, we're having a hearing today on this matter; it's an 23

24 adjudication; I have to do notice according to Rule 4.

25 It's also a meeting of the Commission, and I have to do

notice according to the Open Meetings Act. What we 1 2 tried to do in -- and this is sort of saying, you know, we'll post notice of these meetings -- a meeting on the 3 4 Internet, send it out to the people on the mailing list. In terms of other notice, publication notice, notice to 5 specific parties, that is governed by whether there is a 6 7 hearing going on at that meeting or not. So that way Florene's not trying to have to merge two types of 8 notices to the newspapers and meet this or that. So 9 Rule 3 and Rule 4 will largely govern the meetings. 10 Okay? 11

12 This is an unusual meeting today because it's a meeting -- it's just a meeting of the Commission, 13 and you have no hearings planned. So in this case, this 14 would be the rare occasion in which this resolution 15 would govern entirely how you give notice. Almost every 16 other meeting you have, because there is a hearing going 17 on, that hearing rules will also govern to provide for 18 notice in the newspapers, whether it's statewide or 19 local, to joining landowners, whatever is necessary, 20 21 whatever notice is required for that type of hearing. So we just tried to make the resolution fit 22 more with the practice of the Commission and merge 23 24 better with your rules for other kinds of hearings so 25 that we're not tripping over ourselves, and we're -- in

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Page 7 other words, we're doing what we say we do in the 1 2 resolution. So that's the basis of the changes that are in there for this year's resolution. 3 4 Do you have any questions? 5 And thank you, Mr. Brooks. He actually 6 spent a bunch of time helping us work on this and 7 defining these issues. 8 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: Thank you, 9 Mr. Brancard. I don't have any questions. 10 If the Commissioners would like time to 11 12 read through the document before they sign it, that would be fine, too. We can just sign that during the 13 course of today's --14 COMMISSIONER BALCH: That'll be fine. 15 16 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: Okay. 17 COMMISSIONER BALCH: I can look at the 18 final --19 COMMISSIONER PADILLA: Right. 20 MR. BRANCARD: You have to take action on 21 it at some point. 22 COMMISSIONER PADILLA: Probably later. 23 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: As long as we don't 24 forget to do it later. 25 MR. BRANCARD: Yeah. You can move it to

Page 8 later. 1 2 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: We'll do that. We'll delay that vote until -- until the Commissioners have 3 4 had time to review this. COMMISSIONER BALCH: This looks like what I 5 6 read before so I can vote now. 7 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: And I've read it myself. 8 9 Do you want to glance at it a minute, or do 10 you want --COMMISSIONER PADILLA: Glance? 11 12 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: Do you want to read it? 13 COMMISSIONER BALCH: Speed read? 14 (Pause in proceedings.) 15 MR. BRANCARD: Commissioner Balch is 16 correct. There is a lot of language in the resolution that is just carried over. 17 COMMISSIONER BALCH: Well, I know that 18 Florene's been working on that, and your explanation is 19 very clear that we don't have to worry about those as 20 21 much as we have in the past. MR. BRANCARD: What this Commission does is 22 actually somewhat unusual, in giving the public exact 23 24 dates for the entire year. But I think you want to give 25 yourself the flexibility to deal with circumstances as

Page 9 they evolve over the course of the year as long as you 1 2 meet --COMMISSIONER PADILLA: With the built-in 3 flexibility, I think it's fine. I can go ahead and sign 4 it if you want. 5 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: Well, let's vote on it. 6 7 Do I hear a motion to approve the Annual Resolution for 2017? 8 9 COMMISSIONER PADILLA: So moved. 10 COMMISSIONER BALCH: Seconded. CHAIRMAN CATANACH: All in favor? 11 12 (Ayes are unanimous.) 13 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: And the Annual 14 Resolution is approved, and we can sign it. 15 (Proceedings conclude, 9:12 a.m.) 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25

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
