Page 2 (9:00 a.m.) 1 2 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: Good morning. This is a meeting of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission. 3 My name is David Catanach, Chairman of the Commission. 4 The time is 9:00 a.m., and today's date is November 9th, 5 б 2017. This meeting is being conducted in Porter Hall 7 within the Wendell Chino State Building. At this time I will take roll. Will the 8 Commissioners be so kind to introduce themselves for the 9 record? 10 11 COMMISSIONER MARTIN: Ed Martin, New Mexico 12 State Land Office designee. 13 COMMISSIONER BALCH: Dr. Robert Balch, designee of the Secretary of Energy, Minerals and 14 Natural Resources. 15 16 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: Thank you, 17 Commissioners. 18 Also present today is Mr. Bill Brancard, 19 Commission attorney, and Ms. Florene Davidson. 20 Commissioners, in your packet today, you should have an agenda for today's meeting. If you've 21 22 reviewed the agenda, do I have a motion and second to 23 adopt the agenda? 24 COMMISSIONER BALCH: I have reviewed the 25 agenda, and I move to adopt it.

Page 3 1 COMMISSIONER MARTIN: Second. 2 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: All in favor? 3 (Ayes are unanimous.) 4 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: The motion to adopt 5 today's agenda is passed. Also in your packet are the minutes from 6 7 the October 4th, 2017 Commission hearing. 8 Commissioners, again, have you reviewed the 9 minutes? Do you have any changes, and if not, do I hear a motion to adopt the minutes? 10 11 COMMISSIONER MARTIN: I have reviewed them. 12 I have no changes, and I would move to adopt. 13 COMMISSIONER BALCH: I also have reviewed them. I have no changes and second the motion. 14 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: All in favor? 15 16 (Ayes are unanimous.) 17 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: The motion to adopt the minutes from the October 4, 2017 meeting is passed. 18 19 With regards to today's docket, I'll make 20 one announcement. Case Number 15856, which is the application of Stakeholder Gas Services, LLC for 21 22 approval to drill and operate two acid gas injection 23 wells in Lea County, New Mexico, that case is on the 24 docket today, but it will be continued to the Commission 25 meeting on January 18th, 2018.

3	CHAIRMAN CATANACH: Still on the record,
4	and Mr. Brancard's going to give us an update.
5	MR. BRANCARD: Yeah. So yesterday morning
б	we had an argument in the case of Jalapeno versus the
7	Commission appealing the Matador decision. This
8	argument was limited to a motion filed by Matador to
9	dismiss two of the five issues that Jalapeno presented.
10	And basically the reason for the motion was, the motion
11	that they were asking the Court Jalapeno was asking
12	the Court to throw out what they call Rule 35. It's the
13	rule for the risk charge. And Matador's argument was
14	that really that's beyond the Commission's power I
15	mean the tort's power in this case because this is a
16	peer review of the Commission's decision, and the
17	Commission's decision wasn't based on the parts of the
18	rule that Jalapeno's upset with. Jalapeno's upset with
19	the presumption in the rule and with the service
20	equipment cost. And, essentially, the Commission heard
21	all the evidence, applied the 150 percent and didn't
22	apply the service equipment cost.
23	So Matador made the argument to the Court
24	that if you reverse the Commission, you haven't
25	solved if you throw out the ruling, you haven't

really changed the order, you know, because the order 1 wasn't relying on that regulation, the presumption. 2 3 Michael Feldewert kind of had the judge with him through his argument, and then when Gene 4 5 Gallegos got up, he got the judge a little confused. So б the judge got confused by the fact that what the 7 Commission did in the case -- and in hindsight perhaps 8 we could have done this differently -- is the Commission 9 actually ruled on Jalapeno's motion to throw out the regulation, and the Commission said, Well, that 10 11 regulation looks fine to us. 12 Really, you didn't have any authority to throw out a regulation. Okay? So you could have just 13 thrown out that part of their motion by saying, We have 14 no authority to do this anyway. But the Commission 15 16 said, This is a reasonable rule; we're fine with it. So on that basis, the judge was sort of like, Well, maybe I 17 18 am reviewing what the Commission did then, even though 19 the Commission did have authority. 20 So I didn't really get to say anything in But I didn't really file anything with the 21 that case. 22 motion. I kind of made the same argument but in 23 response to their main brief in the case, so an arm -- I 24 said the Commission -- the Court really didn't have 25 authority to hear these points anyway.

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So the judge did not rule. He wanted to see parts -- he wanted to -- for us to show him which parts of the record dealt with the issue in front of the Commission, in other words, Jalapeno's motion, Matador's response, the Commission hearing on the motion. And so I believe the argument today shifts off references to the judge.

8 He's likely going to call the lawyers back 9 in and sort of verbally rule on this motion. Either way, we've still got to deal with the rest of the issues 10 11 in the case. So this motion wasn't going to solve the 12 case one way or the other, you know. And he is apparently willing to sort of just rule orally as 13 opposed to writing a decision, which if you read today's 14 "New Mexican," a little case in the corner about voting 15 16 rights, state employees have to get time to vote even in a municipal election, paid time to vote. He was 17 18 actually ruling on that when we walked in the courtroom, 19 literally talking into a speakerphone to the other 20 attorneys and giving a ruling. So that's what he's 21 probably going to do on this case on the motion, just 22 sort of talk to the attorneys, Here's my ruling, because 23 waiting for a written decision from him is difficult, 24 because as you know, we've been waiting 15 months for a 25 decision in the geothermal case from the same judge.

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Page 7 COMMISSIONER BALCH: Now that we've had 1 2 ingestion added to our lunch schedule --3 MR. BRANCARD: Yes. CHAIRMAN CATANACH: Any timetable on when 4 5 we're going to hear the actual case? MR. BRANCARD: Well, and here's the odd 6 7 part. Nobody has asked for an oral argument on the full 8 case. So I think if he brings the lawyers in, I will 9 certainly bring up to him, to the judge, Do you want 10 oral arguments on the full case? Okay? Because some of 11 these judges have a policy of they will not issue a 12 decision unless they hear arguments by the lawyers. Whereas, some probably are willing to just sort of look 13 at the written briefs and issue a decision, and so 14 whatever it takes to get into a decision, you know. 15 We 16 don't want him sitting there waiting for the parties to ask for an oral argument and nobody does. 17 18 CHAIRMAN CATANACH: Okay. 19 MR. BRANCARD: It'll be a while. 20 COMMISSIONER BALCH: All right. Thank you, 21 Mr. Brancard. 22 This Commission hearing is adjourned. 23 (The proceedings conclude, 11:50 a.m.) 24 25
