
The Hilcorp 2018 Plans of Development (POD) for the Cox Canyon Unit located in San Juan County, New Mexico is approved as of June 20, 2018. A POD is required to be filed yearly by the unit operator and not later than March 1 of each year. This later submittal is justified by the recent acquisition of the leases and unit from XTO Energy.

It is important to note at this time that Hilcorp is evaluating opportunities throughout the unit to maintain and increase production and will conduct repairs and replace facilities required to maintain and increase field production.

At this time no further submittal of a formal POD is required until March of 2019. The Cox Canyon unit contains no Tribal or Navajo allotted lands.
