- 2 EXAMINER GOETZE: Good morning, ladies and
- 3 gentlemen. Today is Thursday, June 28th, 2018. This is
- 4 the Oil Conservation Division examiner hearing, Docket
- 5 Number 28-18, here in Porter Hall.
- 6 The first order of business will be to go
- 7 through the docket with the changes and schedule
- 8 appearances.
- 9 First page, there are no changes -- or page
- 10 2.
- Page 3, no changes.
- 12 Page 4, Case Number 16185 has been
- 13 continued to July 12th. Case 16186 has been continued
- 14 to July 12th.
- 15 Page 5, Cases Number 16137 and 16138 have
- 16 both been continued to July 12th.
- 17 Page 6, Cases 16139, 16140, 16141 and
- 18 16041, all the cases on this page have been continued to
- 19 July 12th.
- 20 Page 7, Case Number 16042 has been
- 21 dismissed. Cases 16048, 16206 and 16228 have been
- 22 continued to July 12th.
- Page 8, Case Number 16221 has been
- 24 continued to July 12th.

- 16 Bradfute. On pages 2 and 3, Cases 16076, 16077, 16024,
- 17 16161 and, on page 3, 16162 have all been continued to a
- 18 special docket on July the 13th.
- 19 EXAMINER GOETZE: When did this happen?
- 20 MS. BRADFUTE: About a week or two ago.
- MR. FELDEWERT: Yeah.
- 22 EXAMINER GOETZE: When Mr. Jones was in
- 23 charge?
- MS. BRADFUTE: Yes. Yes.
- 25 MR. FELDEWERT: We'll blame it on him.

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1 (Laughter.)
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- 2 EXAMINER GOETZE: Okay. Thank you.
- 3 MR. BRUCE: Mr. Examiner --
- 4 EXAMINER GOETZE: I just talked to you.
- 5 What do you have now?
- 6 MR. BRUCE: Well, I have an older one, Case
- 7 67, page 17, 16236. Please continue that one to July
- 8 12th.
- 9 EXAMINER GOETZE: Any other corrections,
- 10 additions or subtractions?
- 11 Very good.
- 12 Shall we make a little announcement about
- 13 the rule change?
- 14 EXAMINER BROOKS: Yes. The rules have
- 15 changed.
- 16 (Laughter.)
- MR. HALL: What do they say?
- 18 EXAMINER BROOKS: The revised horizontal
- 19 well rule went into effect on Tuesday. The result of
- 20 that is that if you have an approved APD that was
- 21 approved before the new rule came into effect, you do
- 22 not need a nonstandard spacing unit because the
- 23 designated -- the old rule said you designate a project
- 24 area by filing a Form C-102. The new rule says that any
- 25 approved project area -- that any project area that's in

1 existence on the date that the rule becomes effective

- 2 becomes a nonstandard spacing unit automatically. So I
- 3 think so far as it affects what we're doing now, that
- 4 will be the only one.
- 5 EXAMINER GOETZE: So be leery and wary and
- 6 look at your numbers and dates when you make an
- 7 application for the rule we're going to follow at this
- 8 point. If you have any questions, you certainly
- 9 approach us. We may confuse you even more. That's why
- 10 we're referring to Mr. David Brooks as our --
- 11 EXAMINER BROOKS: Of course, there is
- 12 probably very little in your presentation that will be
- 13 relevant only to your requests for nonstandard spacing
- 14 units. Probably most all of it is also applicable to
- 15 your requests for compulsory pooling, which hasn't
- 16 changed. And I assume all of you are here to get
- 17 nonstandard spacing units and compulsory pooling. We
- 18 don't do anything else these days.
- 19 EXAMINER GOETZE: Very good. In that case
- 20 we'll get started by clearing up outstanding notice
- 21 issues.
