
Dear Mr. Sandoval,

The Artesia office of OCD and Mike Bradford thought it was a good idea to express my concerns and ask that this letter be made a part of the file.

The following are issues that would be the result of an injection well on subdivision property off Illinois Camp Road in Eddy County, NM.

- 1) The existing road is marginal, at best; and, the volume of traffic would destroy the road. The road is narrow and has two 90-degree turns and crosses an unlighted railroad track.
- 2) The 500-acre subdivision is all residential. The possible volume proposed (40,000 BPD), at 130 barrels per truck, would be 300 truckloads per day. This would be a dangerous condition on the existing roadway.
- 3) Lastly, the subdivision has restrictive covenants; and, on page 8, Section 22, I quote, "No tract shall be leased for any kind or character of business or commercial purpose."
