Page 3 HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: Moving then to Matter 19. 1 This is Case Number 20831. Centennial is the applicant, 2 3 compulsory pooling application for a well named Margarita 4 36. 5 Is that you, Mr. Feldewert, from Holland & Hart? 6 MR. FELDEWERT: (No audio.) 7 HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: You are muted. 8 MR. FELDEWERT: Sorry about that. Yes, Madam Examiner, Michael Feldewert from the Santa Fe office of 9 10 Holland & Hart appearing on behalf of Centennial Resource Production LLC. 11 12 HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: Thank you very much. And 13 Ms. Shaheen, are you here for V-F Petroleum Fuel Product 14 Energy and (unclear audio). 15 MS. SHAHEEN: Yes, Madam Examiner, I am. And this Centennial case is competing with the V-F Petroleum 16 20 -- I think it's 661 and 20662 on the docket following 17 this Centennial case. 18 19 HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: Yes. That's right, that's why I grouped them. So the other case numbers are 20 20861 and 20862, V-F Petroleum, the applicant in each case, 21 compulsory pooling applications. The well names are Getty 22 23 1, and we have you, Ms. Shaheen, as applicant's counsel, and 24 then Centennial, I assume you, Mr. Feldewert, entered an 25 appearance in each of those?

Page 4 MR. FELDEWERT: Correct, Madam Examiner. 1 2 HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: All right. Okay. I also noted that prehearing statements 3 4 had been filed by the applicants -- by Centennial, excuse me, in all three matters, and that V-F Petroleum and others 5 6 had also filed prehearing statements. So are we doing a 7 status conference this morning? 8 MR. FELDEWERT: Well, I -- I had hoped to view 9 this as a prehearing conference, Madam Examiner. As you 10 know, we have been trying to get this case -- these competing cases scheduled for hearing. I think it was like 11 12 April, I saw the hearing in May and V-F filed an opposed 13 motion stating they did not have consent to a virtual 14 hearing on competing applications at this time, and stating 15 it's not fair to present its witnesses in audio and visual formats as required by the Division's notice. 16 As a result, we did (unclear audio) scheduled 17 hearing in May and these cases were bumped to today's 18 docket, for what I hoped would be for the purpose of 19 scheduling a virtual hearing. Ms. Shaheen, and I have 20 conferred. I requested a hearing in June. Ms. Shaheen 21 indicated that her client did not want to go to hearing any 22 23 earlier than perhaps late July. 24 So recognizing my leverage was limited here, I 25 conceded to a hearing in late July, and I actually drafted a

prehearing order, as you and I had previously discussed in another case, for the purposes of sending it to you, leaving the hearing date blank.

I sent that to Ms. Shaheen, and she and I have conferred about it. I think, as far as I know, there is no -- there is no longer or not any issues associated with that, so I'm hoping to be able to present it to you after this hearing so that you can make whatever changes you need to make to the prehearing order and get this matter scheduled for a hearing in late July.

HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: All right. Thank you,Mr. Feldewert. Ms. Shaheen?

13 MS. SHAHEEN: Thank you, Madam Examiner. Mr. 14 Feldewert is correct, I don't believe we have any issues 15 with the prehearing order that he's proposed, although we want to consider whether there is a need for another 16 prehearing conference to address logistical issues and also 17 whether there may be a need for post -- excuse me -- for 18 pretrial motions. So I'm going to confer with my client in 19 that regard and get back with Mr. Feldewert about that. 20

He is correct that we are requesting a date in late July -- in part, I will take this on myself -- in part, I'm hoping to be out of state for the first couple of weeks in July. So I think we are in agreement. I will continue to confer with Mr. Feldewert so we can get a prehearing

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1 order to you as soon as possible.

2	I did have a couple of questions about the
3	logistics of it. I don't know if this is the right time or
4	not, but just trying to envision how, how is there any
5	way to move forward, particularly with respect to exhibits,
б	whether the Division anticipates everyone having exhibits
7	there electronically themselves each alone, or whether the
8	Division is anticipating some sort of video presentation of
9	the exhibits during the hearing itself, while the parties
10	are cross-examining.
11	I don't know if you have had an opportunity to
12	consider that, but I did have that question and thought I
13	would ask it today.
14	HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: Well, thank you for
15	the thank you for the question, actually, Ms. Shaheen. I
16	have a few e-mails, things are evolving. Let me just share
17	a few things I think are important about exhibits. One is
18	that they be submitted before the hearing so that everyone
19	has it in hand before the hearing with the potential
20	exception of of, I don't know, surrebuttal exhibits or
21	some things that might have to be presented after, after
22	hearing another party's evidence.
23	But I want to discourage any recantation of
24	exhibits that wouldn't come in before the hearing, at least
25	a little bit. Certainly having the exhibits available,

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Page 7 these would cross-examine (unclear audio) questions a 1 2 presenter, and I think it would be good if, for example, in the hearing we could share a screen allowing someone to 3 4 refer to an exhibit during the examination. 5 I imagine that that will be technically possible by late July. At this moment, other than using, for 6 7 example, this Webex mechanism or Zoom mechanism, I'm not 8 sure how to assure that it would happen other than through, for example, a mechanism like this. 9 10 As I understand it, it might be possible by late July for us to accommodate both people in person and 11 12 virtually, but we won't, again, be certain about that until 13 we get closer to that date. 14 In the meantime, I want to encourage you to send me the prehearing order when you have it as finished as you 15 can have it between yourselves, and then I will set up a, 16 not private, but not a Thursday morning session with you, a 17 prehearing conference so we can actually get the order 18 finalized. I will do that after I get the order via e-mail. 19 20 EXAMINER MURPHY: Madam Examiner? 21 HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: Ms. Murphy. EXAMINER MURPHY: I do have a little insight on 22 23 this. If you noticed on that ad that goes across with the 24 mute and unmute button, there is a share content, and you 25 should be able to show the PDF exhibits and talk along and

1 explain them.

2	So we do this in the teams meetings and in Zoom,
3	and you see that button there in the Webex, so it is
4	available for you to show the PDF, discuss what page you're
5	on and just go through as if you are in a regular hearing
6	with your exhibits being shown on that TV screen just like
7	we would be in Porter Hall.
8	HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: All right. Thank you.
9	MR. FELDEWERT: Just a point of clarification,
10	Madam Examiner, I believe all I need to do is it okay,
11	once I get the approval from Ms. Shaheen, to go ahead and
12	e-mail to you, to the OCD Division, a Word version of the
13	pretrial order so that you can easily modify as needed to
14	fit whatever the Division wants to utilize?
15	HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: Thank you. That's an
16	excellent, excellent point. Word is always good.
17	MR. FELDEWERT: And then secondly, do you
18	envision perhaps since we are shooting for the end of July,
19	perhaps having this matter placed again on the second docket
20	in June for the purpose of providing an update on where we
21	stand in having virtual hearings and to address whatever
22	other questions that may arise between now and then? Would
23	that be helpful?
24	HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: So let me talk with the
25	Division staff about that. Because once, once we are

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Page 9 marching toward hearing, I'm not sure that it needs to be 1 included on another docket. That is to say, we may be able 2 to do more targeted meetings, me and you and Ms. Shaheen and 3 4 whoever else needs to be involved. 5 Let me check with the staff about that, and one 6 of us will get back to you. I'm hoping we can just go, if 7 you will, off-line to discuss your case. 8 MR. FELDEWERT: So then I will -- my task will be 9 to confer with Ms. Shaheen one more time and try to get to 10 you possibly today or tomorrow what we put together as a prehearing order. 11 12 HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: Thank you. 13 Ms. Shaheen, anything further? 14 MS. SHAHEEN: No, Madam Examiner. Thank you for 15 the clarification. HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: Thank you. All right. 16 17 So thank you both and wait for the prehearing order. 18 MR. FELDEWERT: Thank you.
