- 1 MADAM HEARING OFFICER ORTH: Good morning
- 2 everyone. We are back on the record in Case
- 3 Number 21834. These were proposed amendments to the
- 4 Commission's rules on releases, 19.15.29.6, 29.8 and
- 5 29.15.
- 6 We completed the live evidentiary record
- 7 portion of the hearing yesterday and written public
- 8 comment was due by 5:00 p.m. last night. We had
- 9 just the written public comment that was referred to
- 10 yesterday during the hearing from Ralph Wrons and
- 11 Intrepid Potash.
- 12 At the end of the record yesterday I had
- 13 asked counsel to say whether they choose to make any
- 14 rebuttal, at least on evidence that had come in
- 15 during the hearing, the answer was no from all
- 16 parties.
- 17 Let me pause for a moment in the event
- 18 there is anyone who believes based on the written
- 19 public comment that they would like to put on
- 20 rebuttal.
- I hear nothing, and we did do a sound
- 22 check this morning with all counsel, so I know all
- 23 counsel are on the platform.
- 24 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Ms. Orth, it looks
- 25 like Mr. Aims was trying to say something.

- 1 MADAM HEARING OFFICER ORTH: Mr. Ames?
- 2 MR. AMES: Good morning, Ms. Orth. I just
- 3 want to clarify. The comments that were received
- 4 are not testimony. They have not been admitted into
- 5 evidence, and I think there would be some hazard for
- 6 the Commission to rely upon those comments in making
- 7 its decision.
- 8 So with that, we do not intend to present
- 9 any testimony regarding those comments. All the
- 10 parties have rested. The parties have presented
- 11 witnesses and rested. The others did not, and
- 12 statements of counsel regarding comments would not
- 13 be probative in any event, so that is all I need to
- 14 say.
- 15 Thank you.
- 16 MADAM HEARING OFFICER ORTH: All right.
- 17 So we might have a discussion about how the
- 18 Commission can weigh written public comments.
- 19 Again, they are not taken under oath or subject to
- 20 cross-examination.
- 21 They are part of the larger record, I
- 22 think, the Commission considers in their
- 23 decision-making, but I will leave that in the event
- 24 they had questions, how about that? I will leave
- 25 that to Mr. Moander. I was just following a line of

- 1 inquiry that was just suggested.
- 2 So, Madam Chair, there really isn't any
- 3 other evidence to come in. The record is closed.
- 4 Public comment is closed. And if you would like to
- 5 begin your deliberations this morning, I think you
- 6 have everything you need.
- 7 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Thank you, Ms. Orth.
- 8 All right. Commissioners, I think it is likely and
- 9 easiest to work off of OCD Exhibit 6.
- Does everybody have OCD Exhibit 6?
- 11 MR. MOANDER: Madam Chair, just so you
- 12 know, if you want to do what we did last time in the
- 13 venting and flaring hearing, I do have a draft up on
- 14 my screen that could be put up for everyone to look
- 15 at. I don't know how you like to do that because
- 16 this is a much lighter document than the last couple
- 17 we worked on. I think it's pretty straightforward,
- 18 so I will leave that up to you, but that option is,
- 19 of course, on the table.
- 20 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: That might be
- 21 helpful just to make sure we are all looking at the
- 22 same thing at the same time.
- MR. MOANDER: I will just state the
- 24 obvious, but to be clear, when things are completed
- 25 I will remove the draft watermark.

- 1 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: It is sort of hard
- 2 to see on there, but Commissioners, unless you have
- 3 any other preference, I think we just sort of roll
- 4 down it and have discussion.
- 5 So 19.15.29.6, the proposal by OCD, WEG
- 6 and agreed upon by IPANM and NMOGA was to add in the
- 7 objectives, that the objective was to prohibit
- 8 releases and require persons and the change there is
- 9 adding, "prohibit releases," which makes spilling
- 10 prohibited.
- 11 There was testimony from Mr. Griswold on,
- 12 I think, why that change was made and the potential
- 13 benefits of that change. I am agreeable with it.
- 14 Commissioner Bloom and Commissioner
- 15 Warnell, do you have any comments and do you agree
- 16 on that change?
- 17 COMMISSIONER BLOOM: Madam Chair, I do
- 18 agree with these changes, particularly based on the
- 19 testimony provided by Mr. Griswold of the OCD,
- 20 specifically when he spoke to the number of
- 21 releases, spills that happened between 2010 and
- 22 2020, more than 12,000 were identified, according to
- 23 his testimony because including about 7,000 releases
- of produced water and 4,000 releases of crude oil.
- I pointed out that, "During 2020 alone,

- 1 operators reported more than 700 releases involving
- 2 produced water, of which 330 were major, defined as
- 3 25 barrels or more; 398 releases involving crude
- 4 oil, of which 90 were major."
- 5 So seeing that and having heard no
- 6 objections from anybody among the parties involved
- 7 here nor in public comment, I believe that these are
- 8 solid changes and I am supportive of the changes and
- 9 language here.
- 10 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Just to be clear, I
- 11 think the only opposition we heard in general was
- 12 from written comment from Intrepid Potash, but
- otherwise everybody, all the parties were
- 14 supportive.
- 15 Commissioner Warnell?
- 16 COMMISSIONER WARNELL: Good morning, Madam
- 17 Chair. I also heard some very positive support from
- 18 all of the parties yesterday with the exception of
- 19 Intrepid, so I think we can go forward.
- 20 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Thank you. Okay.
- 21 That change adding the, "prohibit
- 22 releases, " is approved. It looks like also in
- 23 19.15.29.6 there was a minor modification just sort
- of in formatting. "Procedures" was moved up, so
- 25 that it states, "And to establish procedures for

- 1 reporting site assessment remediation, closure,
- 2 variance and enforcement."
- I think based on Mr. Griswold's testimony
- 4 and this being, I think, in general a relatively
- 5 minor change just cleaning up some of the language,
- 6 I am good with moving that word and making the
- 7 change.
- 8 MR. MOANDER: So, Madam Chair, I want to
- 9 just interject here with an idea. Because we are
- 10 going down to the subsection here, essentially, why
- 11 don't we go through and do the changes because they
- 12 are fairly minimal and then I am going to have -- I
- 13 propose the Commission do a quick vote.
- So basically there will be a vote on 6, 8,
- 15 15, and I think that is it. So you are going to do
- 16 them kind of a lump sum.
- 17 So what I recommend is there be a motion
- 18 to just vote on 29.6 and the changes that have been
- 19 discussed and found favorable to date and we can
- 20 just vote on it that way or you can vote on it that
- 21 way.
- 2.2 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Before we vote I
- 23 just want to make sure if Commissioner Bloom or
- 24 Warnell have any comments on moving "Procedures" and
- 25 changing up that piece of 6.

- 1 COMMISSIONER BLOOM: Madam Chair, I do
- 2 not. It makes sense to move the word "procedures"
- 3 as discussed by Mr. Griswold in his testimony.
- 4 Thank you.
- 5 COMMISSIONER WARNELL: Commissioner
- 6 Warnell is okay with it.
- 7 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Thank you.
- 8 Mr. Moander, do you want to do a roll call
- 9 vote for approval of the changes to 19.15.29 -- I'm
- 10 sorry.
- 11 First, is there a motion to adopt the
- 12 changes as proposed in 19.15.29.6?
- 13 COMMISSIONER BLOOM: Madam Chair, I move
- 14 to approve the changes as identified in 19.15.29.6.
- 15 MADAM HEARING OFFICER ORTH: Is there a
- 16 second?
- 17 COMMISSIONER WARNELL: I second that
- 18 motion.
- 19 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: All right.
- Now, Mr. Moander, would you please do a
- 21 role call vote for us.
- MR. MOANDER: Yes, Madam Chair.
- 23 Commissioner Warnell?
- 24 COMMISSIONER WARNELL: Yes, I vote yes.
- MR. MOANDER: Commissioner Bloom?

and for natural gas midstream operations that were
just approved by and voted on by the Commission and
went into effect in May.

And those rules piggyback off of Part 29
for some of the release reporting. Releases in
those rules being referred to or being natural
gas-type releases, but Part 29 covers natural gas
releases as well as releases of liquids.

So in 27 and 28, but there are required

- 1 reporting pieces and there was extensive testimony
- 2 during those hearings aligning Parts 27 and 28 with
- 3 Part 29 so that operators aren't having to report
- 4 two different -- I'm sorry, so that operators aren't
- 5 having to report one release two different times on
- 6 two different forms, so there was an alignment of
- 7 Part 27 and 28 with Part 29.
- 8 And so because of that and because of, I
- 9 think, the extensive testimony that was done at
- 10 those hearings, you know, I think that this addition
- 11 by the OCD makes sense. If not, it really would
- 12 change sort of the broader intent and discussions
- 13 and testimony that was heard in Parts 27 and 28 and
- 14 that went through extensive processes, so I am good
- 15 with the addition, one, of A in general as well as
- 16 the addition of the exception in Parts 27 and 28 in
- 17 order to not undermine the regulations that were
- 18 just passed by the Commission a couple of months
- 19 ago.
- 20 Commissioners Bloom or Warnell, do you
- 21 have any discussion on that point?
- 22 COMMISSIONER BLOOM: Madam Chair, I agree
- 23 that these are warranted changes to the rule. As
- 24 you noted and as Mr. Griswold noted in his
- 25 testimony, the Parts 27 and 28 were just recently

- 1 changed this year and made to come into alignment
- 2 with Part 29. So this is important language to have
- 3 in this update to this rule.
- 4 Thank you.
- 5 COMMISSIONER WARNELL: Madam Chair,
- 6 Commissioner Warnell, I agree with the addition of
- 7 Paragraph A.
- 8 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Thank you.
- 9 The only other changes on here just
- 10 correspond with adding A. A is now B, B is now C,
- 11 and there were no other changes proposed in that
- 12 section.
- So with that, I will ask if there is a
- 14 motion to adopt the changes that were in OCD
- 15 Exhibit 6 in 19.15.29.8.
- 16 COMMISSIONER BLOOM: Madam Chair, I move
- 17 to adopt the changes to 19.15.29.8.
- 18 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Is there a second?
- 19 COMMISSIONER WARNELL: Madam Chair, I
- 20 second that motion.
- 21 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Mr. Moander, would
- 22 you do a roll call vote, please.
- MR. MOANDER: Yes, Madam Chair.
- 24 Commissioner Bloom?
- 25 COMMISSIONER BLOOM: Yes.

- 1 MR. MOANDER: Commissioner Warnell?
- 2 COMMISSIONER WARNELL: Yes.
- 3 MR. MOANDER: Madam Chair?
- 4 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Yes.
- 5 MR. MOANDER: The motion passes
- 6 unanimously.
- 7 (Unanimous vote, motion passes.)
- 8 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Thank you.
- 9 Last but certainly not least are the
- 10 changes to 19.15.29.15. There are a handful of
- 11 changes here predominantly focused on aligning this
- 12 rule with the penalties rule that OCD deems the
- 13 authority for during the 2019 legislative session
- 14 and then passed an associated rule at the beginning
- 15 of 2020.
- 16 And there were some changes that were
- 17 testified by from Mr. Griswold explaining why they
- 18 were being -- primarily these are alignment changes
- 19 and just a little bit of formatting.
- In lieu of an agreed compliance order in
- 21 15B, the rule refers to stipulated final orders, so
- 22 aligning that language with the penalties rule.
- The same thing in C, making sure that
- 24 language is aligned and then striking D, again, in
- 25 order to align everything with the new authority

- 1 that OCD gained starting in January of 2020.
- 2 So this would make sure that our rules are
- 3 aligned with one another, which I think is
- 4 important, particularly in this section which, you
- 5 know, I think is -- this section takes on some new
- 6 meaning now that spills are prohibited. So it is an
- 7 important section to align with our other rules and
- 8 authority.
- 9 Commissioner Bloom and Commissioner
- 10 Warnell, do you have any discussion on the changes
- 11 in 19.15.29.15?
- 12 COMMISSIONER BLOOM: Madam Chair, thank
- 13 you. I also stand in support of these changes to
- 14 Section 15. I agree it is important to align this
- 15 rule with OCD's penalty rule, which changed
- 16 recently. I realize just about updating our rules
- 17 and making sure that they are in close alignment. I
- 18 believe I asked Mr. Griswold a question about this
- 19 language and it certainly satisfied my question, I
- 20 should say, so I would stand in support.
- 21 Thank you.
- 22 COMMISSIONER WARNELL: Madam Chair,
- 23 Commissioner Warnell here, I also support the
- 24 changes to 19.15.29.15.
- 25 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: I guess just to be

- 1 thorough here, there was some discussion by public
- 2 commenters as well as, I believe, the Intervenors in
- 3 19.15.29.15(a) that the terminology should be that
- 4 the Division "shall" take enforcement actions as
- 5 opposed to Division "may" take enforcement actions.
- 6 So just to be thorough I think it is good
- 7 to bring that up in the discussion. In multiple
- 8 rulemakings, including the waste rulemaking that the
- 9 Division just underwent, I think there has been a
- 10 lot of discussion about the importance of
- 11 maintaining the Division's enforcement discretion.
- 12 Each individual case is unique and it is important
- 13 to, you know, allow the Division to manage
- 14 enforcement as they see fit.
- And so I think that there is support to
- 16 maintain the original proposal that says the
- 17 Division "may" take enforcement action. This was
- 18 the language that is agreed upon by OCD and WEG in
- 19 their original proposal. It was agreed upon by two
- 20 of the other parties NMOGA and IPANM, and so I think
- 21 that that language should continue to say "may" as
- 22 opposed to "shall."
- Commissioners, do you have any comments on
- 24 that additional piece in 15A?
- MR. MOANDER: Madam Chair, if I may

- 1 interject here. I believe this was also the
- 2 section, I don't have the Intervenors rule in front
- 3 of me. I believe this was the section also where
- 4 there was a proposal for a rebuttable presumption
- 5 concerning the spills. I believe that is right and
- 6 if that is the case, perhaps maybe touch on that as
- 7 well.
- 8 MADAM HEARING OFFICER ORTH: Mr. Moander,
- 9 ultimately Intervenors withdrew that particular
- 10 proposal.
- 11 MR. MOANDER: That is right, they did.
- 12 You are right so we don't need to touch on that.
- 13 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: That was handled in
- 14 the -- just for the record, that was handled in the
- 15 motions hearing on the 4th and was subject to an
- 16 order that was put out.
- 17 COMMISSIONER BLOOM: Yes, I would just add
- 18 that because of the -- this is also the motion
- 19 hearing and the fact that changes to this were not
- 20 on the table yesterday, I don't really feel that we
- 21 can discuss this at this time, so thank you.
- 22 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: I was going to ask
- 23 if you had any additional comments or discussion on
- 24 that section in A.
- 25 COMMISSIONER WARNELL: Commissioner

- 1 Warnell has no additional comments, so I agree.
- 2 Thank you.
- 3 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Thank you, okay.
- 4 With that is there a motion to adopt the changes as
- is proposed in OCD Exhibit 6 to 19.15.29.15?
- 6 COMMISSIONER BLOOM: Madam Chair, I move
- 7 to adopt the proposed changes to 19.15.29.15 as seen
- 8 in Exhibit 6.
- 9 Thank you.
- 10 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Is there a second?
- 11 COMMISSIONER WARNELL: Madam Chair, I
- 12 second that motion for 29.15.
- 13 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Mr. Moander, would
- 14 you do a roll call vote, please.
- MR. MOANDER: Yes, Madam Chair.
- 16 Commissioner Warnell?
- 17 COMMISSIONER WARNELL: Yes.
- 18 MR. MOANDER: Commissioner Bloom?
- 19 COMMISSIONER BLOOM: Yes.
- MR. MOANDER: Madam Chair?
- 21 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Yes.
- MR. MOANDER: Motion passes unanimously.
- 23 (Unanimous vote, motion passes.)
- 24 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Okay. Well, that
- 25 wraps up the changes. I think we need to discuss,

- 1 okay, so our next scheduled meeting is on July 8.
- 2 I believe that these changes are
- 3 relatively straightforward and could be voted on for
- 4 a final order at that hearing.
- 5 Mr. Moander, is there a proposed -- or
- 6 Ms. Orth, is there a proposed procedure as to how to
- 7 get to that date and to vote on that final order?
- 8 MR. MOANDER: Well, Madam Chair, I was
- 9 planning on doing exactly what we did with the
- 10 venting rule, which is I want to get my hands on the
- 11 transcript from yesterday. I want to prepare a
- 12 thorough order and then get the final versions of
- 13 the rule ready to go.
- 14 Let's see how far out is July 8?
- 15 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: It is like four
- 16 weeks.
- 17 MR. MOANDER: Yeah, I guess it is around
- 18 that. So I don't have a problem being prepared for
- 19 that, but what I would tell the Commissioners, I
- 20 will be out of the office on the 6th and the 7th, so
- 21 I will have that sent out to everybody the week
- 22 before. We will all discuss it with the parties, we
- 23 will have the order, final rule, everything that
- 24 needs to accompany that ready to do and disseminated
- 25 to the parties the week beforehand.

- 1 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Okay.
- 2 MR. MOANDER: I think at that point
- 3 because we will have it noticed, the parties will
- 4 have it, I will work with them on the order to make
- 5 sure everything is where everyone wants it to be and
- 6 needs to be and it really should be fairly
- 7 straightforward and not all that time consuming.
- 8 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Okay. This will be
- 9 added to the docket for the July 8 hearing to vote
- on the final order in 19.15.29 changes that were
- 11 proposed here today.
- 12 Are there any other pieces that we need to
- handle on the rule changes before we move on to the
- 14 other?
- MR. MOANDER: I don't believe so, Madam
- 16 Chair, but as always, I'm open to any other input.
- 17 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Ms. Orth?
- 18 MADAM HEARING OFFICER ORTH: Right. I
- 19 think when you adopt the statement of reasons just
- 20 make sure you remember to authorize the Division to
- 21 make whatever changes they need in order to file the
- 22 rules, but I think that is a task for July 8.
- 23 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Okay. You mean
- 24 adopt them just if there were any formatting
- 25 changes, et cetera, as necessary by the record

- 2 MADAM HEARING OFFICER ORTH: That is what
- 3 I mean.
- 4 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: Makes sense.
- 5 All right. Well, before we move on to
- 6 pending litigation, which is Item Number 5, I just
- 7 want to thank the parties, thank you for your
- 8 collaboration and coordination. I think you have
- 9 made this a relatively smooth process and, you know,
- 10 a very well executed, so thank you-all for your, I
- 11 think, collaboration upfront.

- 15 MR. MOANDER: I would also like to thank

- 19 think this hearing reflects a lot of that in terms
- 20 of how it operated. So that is a thank you from me
- 21 personally.
- 22 COMMISSIONER BLOOM: I will echo what our
- 23 Chairwoman and Mr. Moander said. Thank you all very
- 24 much, I really appreciate it.
- 25 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: All right. With

- 1 that, Mr. Moander, would you give us an update on
- 2 pending litigation.
- 3 MR. MOANDER: As of right now there isn't
- 4 anything to report about any particular case. I am
- 5 going to knock on my desk made of wood. It is a
- 6 nice situation to be in, but, yeah, right now there
- 7 is nothing to report.
- 8 CHAIRWOMAN SANDOVAL: All right. Is there
- 9 any other business before the Commission today?
- 10 All right. Our next regularly scheduled
- 11 meeting is on July 8 at 9 a.m., and with that, I
- 12 will thank everybody for your time the last couple
- of days, and I wish you an almost happy weekend.
- 14 All right. Thank you everybody. Have a
- 15 good morning.
