> REPORTER'S TRANSCRIPT OF VIRTUAL PROCEEDINGS EXAMINER HEARING JULY 9, 2020 SANTA FE, NEW MEXICO

This matter came on for virtual hearing before the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division, HEARING OFFICER FELICIA ORTH and TECHNICAL EXAMINER DYLAN COSS and LEONARD LOWE on Thursday, July 9, 2020, through the Webex Platform.

Page 3 HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: The first is 21282, 1 2 extend Tocito Dome Miss Pool. Miss Pickford are you on the line? 3 4 MS. PICKFORD: I can't get Webex to connect to my camera, so I apologize for that. Can you hear me? 5 6 HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: Yes. There is no camera, 7 that's fine. 8 MS. PICKFORD: Okay. Did you want me to proceed 9 with my presentation? 10 HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: Yes, please. MS. PICKFORD: Okay. For this first case, this 11 12 relates to the Mississippian pools, the (garbled audio) 13 Mississippian. There has been some recent activity which 14 expanded this pool, so I expanded the boundaries based on 15 current activity, and John Garcia was the petroleum engineer when the division reviewed my work to ensure its 16 17 accuracy. So the proposal is simply to extend the full boundaries based on current activity. 18 HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: All right. Does anyone 19 have a question of Miss Pickford about the extension of 20 these pools? 21 22 (No audible response.) 23 HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: I hear no questions, Miss 24 Pickford. Thank you for your proposal on 21282. Let's move 25 then to 21283 relating to nomenclature around some pools.

PAUL BACA PROFESSIONAL COURT REPORTERS 500 FOURTH STREET NW - SUITE 105, ALBUQUERQUE, NM 87102 MS. PICKFORD: In this case (garbled audio) focused on updating records for Entrada pools. There is one pool that's being proposed to be abolished, it's the West Eagle Mesa Entrada. There was a discovery well that created this pool in 2000, and it was created in Order R-11445, however the discovery well never reported to this pool, and no wells have reported to this pool.

8 So OCD is proposing to abolish this pool and the 9 Southeast Arena Blanca Entrada is proposed to expand into 10 the area of the Eagle -- West Eagle Mesa Entrada to accommodate the wells. So they are reporting to the 11 12 Southeast Arena Entrada, and then the Entrada pools in this 13 case are the Leggs Entrada Oil Pool, the Ojo Encino Entrada 14 Oil Pool, the Papers Wash Entrada Oil Pool and the Ute Dome Morrison Gas Pool. And OCD's proposal is just expanding 15 these pool boundaries to accommodate wells that are 16 17 reporting to these pools. Again, John Garcia in the 18 engineering bureau in the OCD reviewed my work to ensure its 19 accuracy.

HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: All right. Thank you,
Miss Pickford. Are there any questions of Miss Pickford?
TECHNICAL EXAMINER COSS: I have a question here,
Good morning, Dylan Coss of the Oil Conservation Division.
So just kind of reviewing the full extension areas, I see
that in some instances, what's being added on to the pool

is -- it isn't very substantial and somewhat discontinuous. 1 2 Is there a potential for wells to be added in between maybe some of these areas that aren't specifically connected and 3 4 therefore needing to expand the pools at some point? 5 MS. PICKFORD: I'm not aware that there is any continuity. There are case files that show where the 6 expansions are occurring, and there are some odd shapes in 7 8 certain cases, especially when there are 40-acre spacing 9 units where they -- like an (garbled audio) that goes 10 laterally across the string of quarter-quarter sections, but everything is connected. There is no broken-off areas that 11 12 aren't attached to somehow. And you know, sometimes these 13 pools do sort of have fingers, they go -- that kind of 14 weave in between each other, but there's, there's no 15 disconnect essentially between -- like there is never there's a pool or an area where another pool could chop it 16 off in between. If that makes sense. 17

TECHNICAL EXAMINER COSS: I see that (garbled 18 audio) they never are broken, but they do make some 19 different shapes. I'm looking at Encino Entrada Pool right 20 now. So that there is currently wells then reporting to 21 this pool, but they aren't officially added to the pool. 22 So hypothetically, if the well was drilled with near this pool, 23 24 but into the same formation, it would be called a wildcat, 25 or would they be reporting to this same pool?

Page 6 MS. PICKFORD: On the northwest (garbled audio) 1 2 two miles to that existing pool boundary, it essentially expands that pool. And what happened is since the 3 4 nomenclature hasn't been kept up to date, that's why we are 5 doing what we are doing now to clean up the pool boundaries. 6 So in order to accommodate, for example, if you 7 are looking at 40-acre spacing, in order to accommodate a 8 well that's been drilled just inside the two-mile limit, 9 there has to be some way to connect it to the existing pool. 10 So that's why sometimes there has to be stringers that run over to the well to be included in the pool. 11 12 TECHNICAL EXAMINER COSS: I see, okay. Those are 13 essentially my questions, and I don't have any more beyond 14 that, so I yield. 15 HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: Oh, thank you, Mr. Coss. Are there other questions of Miss Pickford. 16 17 (No audible response.) 18 HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: No? All right. Well, thank you very much, Miss Pickford. Let me take a moment to 19 note that we have two technical examiners likely to ask 20 questions this morning one is Dylan Rose Coss, and the other 21 22 is Leonard Lowe. 23 And Mr. Coss has reposted the docket worksheet 24 this morning to replace the one with tiny font with somewhat 25 larger font. It's in the same place that the original
