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Page 3 1 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: All right. With 2 that, we will call Cases 22056, 22057, 22059, Matador 3 Production Company. 4 MR. RANKIN: Mr. Examiner, Adam Rankin with the law firm of Holland & Hart Santa Fe office appearing on 5 behalf of the applicant in this case. 6 7 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. I have 8 entries of appearance from Cimarex Energy Company? 9 MR. SAVAGE: Good morning, Mr. Hearing Examiner, 10 Darin Savage with Abadie & Schill on behalf of Cimarex Energy Company. 11 12 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: And ConocoPhillips. 13 MS. MUNDS-DRY: Good morning, Mr. Examiner, Ocean 14 Munds-Dry with ConocoPhillips. HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Are there any other 15 interested persons for Cases 22056, 22057 or 59? 16 17 (No audible response.) HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: I will to turn to Mr. 18 Savage and Ms. Munds-Dry, do you object to these cases 19 moving forward by affidavit? 20 21 MR. SAVAGE: No objection from Cimarex going forward by affidavit. 22 23 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. Ms. 24 Munds-Dry? 25 MS. MUNDS-DRY: Likewise, we have no objection to

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HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. I guessthat means it's up to you, Mr. Rankin.

MR. RANKIN: Thank you, Mr. Examiner. Before I forget, I will state that Matador has reached an agreement with ConocoPhillips and is no longer seeking to pool ConocoPhillips in these three cases, so we can dismiss them from these pooling proceedings.

9 In these three cases Matador is seeking to pool 10 portions of the E/2 of Sections 19 and 30 in Township 21 South, Range 35 East in Lea County. In Cases 22056 and 11 12 22057 Matador is seeking to create a spacing unit and pool 13 the Bone Spring formation. In Case 22059, Matador is 14 seeking to create a spacing unit in the E/2 of those 15 sections and to pool a Wolfcamp formation creating a standard spacing unit in each case. 16

17 Submitted on Tuesday are the affidavits and 18 exhibits that accompany each of these three cases. In each 19 case, Exhibit A is the pooling application checklist 20 identifying the elements of pooling for each of the cases, 21 designated spacing units, the designated wells and the other 22 elements required by the Division.

Exhibit B is a copy of the application filed by Matador in each of the three cases. Exhibit C is a copy of the affidavit of the Ms. Hannah Bollenbach who is a landman

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with Matador. She has not previously testified before the
 Division, so I ask that her credentials be accepted. I can
 briefly review them for you.

4 She is a graduate of the University of Oklahoma, a bachelor's degree in energy management. She began working 5 with Matador as a landman after graduation, overseeing land 6 in Eddy and Lea County, New Mexico. She also previously 7 8 interned with the land department of Matador while she was 9 an undergraduate, and she has also completed her required 10 hours of continuing education as a landman, she is a member of the American Association of Landmen. 11

With that I would ask that Ms. Bollenbach be accepted, her credentials be accepted as a matter of record and she be qualified as an expert in petroleum land matters. HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. Any objection?

17 (No audible response.)

HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Hearing none, Ms.
Bollenbach will be accepted as an expert, and
congratulations on her recent post.

21 MR. RANKIN: Yeah, she is in the workforce. So 22 Ms. Bollenbach testifies about each of the three cases, 23 identifies the spacing units, the wells that will be 24 dedicated thereto. She reviews the -- provides a copy of 25 the C-102s for each of the proposed wells, as well as

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identifies the specific tracts that will comprise each of 1 2 the spacing units, the ownership interest within each one that Matador seeks to pool, and the overriding royalty 3 4 interest as well. In Exhibit C-4 she provides copies of the 5 proposal letters that went out along with the AFEs. And Exhibit D is the affidavit of Andrew Parker 6 7 who is the geologist with the company who has previously 8 testified. His exhibits review the proposed spacing units, 9 identifies the target intervals for each case and confirms 10 that he has not seen or does not see any impediments to developing the spacing unit by horizontal well and each 11 12 tract will contribute more or less equally to production. 13 Exhibit E and F are copies of affidavit of the 14 notice that we provided notice of this hearing and of the 15 application to each of the parties that Matador is seeking to pool. And Exhibit F is the affidavit of publication 16 reflecting each of those parties was identified by name in a 17 publication published back in July of 2021. 18 With that, unless there are any questions, we ask 19 that Exhibits A through F in each of these cases be accepted 20 into the record and that these cases be taken under 21 advisement. 22 23 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Mr. Savage, questions 24 or concerns? 25 MR. SAVAGE: Just one clarification, if I could

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Page 7 ask Mr. Rankin to clarify the agreement with ConocoPhillips 1 that they are no longer seeking to pool. Is it no longer 2 3 seeking to pool ConocoPhillips itself, or did that alter the 4 nature of the unit being pooled? 5 MR. RANKIN: Mr. Savage, the answer to your 6 question is that ConocoPhillips, as I understand, and 7 Matador have reached a voluntary agreement through a JOA, so 8 they are no longer being pooled because their interests are committed to the acreage. 9 10 MR. SAVAGE: Thank you. That's what I thought. Thank you. 11 12 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Ms. Munds-Dry? 13 MS. MUNDS-DRY: Nothing from me, thank you. 14 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Mr. Rose-Coss, 15 questions about these cases? TECHNICAL EXAMINER ROSE-COSS: No, I do not have 16 any questions, per se, a comment. Geology exhibits are 17 better than I am used to seeing, and whatever software 18 Matador is using maybe the other companies should look into 19 because they are superior exhibits. So thanks for that. 20 21 MR. RANKIN: Mr. Rose-Coss, is it because they are more legible, or what in particular --22 23 TECHNICAL EXAMINER ROSE-COSS: The legibility, 24 certainly, the shading on the contour maps, but there is 25 also a legend. As a geologist and a (inaudible) for

Page 8 geology, I tend to (inaudible) seeing a map than without a 1 legend, so that's appreciated. The well lots are also at a 2 scale where the information is legible and visible and 3 identified clearly, so that's all that's all (inaudible). 4 5 MR. RANKIN: Thank you. It's helpful for us so 6 we can convey what the Division is seeking in their exhibits. 7 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Any questions, Mr. 8 9 Rose-Coss? TECHNICAL EXAMINER ROSE-COSS: That's it for me. 10 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: I will confirm, Mr. 11 Rose-Coss really likes the exhibits. We had the discussion 12 13 yesterday. 14 All right. Are there any other persons interested in Cases 22056, 57 and 59? 15 16 (No audible response.) 17 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Hearing none, these cases will be taken under advisement and the exhibits will 18 19 be admitted into the record. 20 MR. RANKIN: Thank you, Mr. Examiner. (Exhibits admitted.) 21 (Taken under advisement.) 22 23 24 25
