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- 1 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: And with that, I
- 2 believe we can start our docket for today. We have a number
- 3 of cases that because there were late filings, they are
- 4 still on the docket, so we can deal with them probably
- 5 pretty quickly. So I will call -- Mr. Bruce, are you ready?
- 6 (No audible response.)
- 7 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Is Mr. Bruce on?
- 8 MS. SALVIDREZ: There is a call-in that should be
- 9 him.
- 10 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: I just saw an e-mail
- 11 from him, so he must be awake. Mr. Bruce, are you there?
- 12 (No audible response.)
- 13 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: All right. Well,
- 14 hearing crickets from Mr. Bruce, we will skip then to Item
- 15 14 on the agenda and this is status conferences. And this
- 16 is a whole series of cases, and I will list them. Case
- 17 Number 21489, 21490, 21491, 21393, 21394, 2139 -- sorry --
- 18 21361, 21362, 21363, 21364. Let's start with Apache
- 19 Corporation.
- 20 MR. DEBRINE: Good morning, Mr. Examiner. Earl
- 21 Debrine with Modrall Sperling for Apache.
- 22 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. Good
- 23 morning. And then we have Ascent Energy.
- MR. SAVAGE: Good morning, Darin Savage with
- 25 Abadie and Schill with Matador Production Company and Ascent

- 1 Energy LLC.
- 2 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: That's right, Matador
- 3 is the successor to Ascent in these cases. Is that correct,
- 4 Mr. Savage?
- 5 MR. SAVAGE: That's correct, Mr. Hearing Officer.
- 6 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. Mewbourne
- 7 Oil Company?
- 8 MS. HARDY: Good morning, Mr. Examiner. Dana
- 9 Hardy with the Santa Fe office of Hinkle Shanor on behalf of
- 10 Mewbourne.
- 11 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. I have
- 12 other entries here. Jalapeno Corporation?
- 13 (No audible response.)
- 14 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Going once. Colgate
- 15 Operating?
- 16 (No audible response.)
- 17 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: I hope people realize
- 18 that the two-hour delay for state employees coming to work
- 19 does not apply to the --
- MS. SHAHEEN: Good morning, Mr. Examiner. Sharon
- 21 Shaheen on behalf of Colgate Operating.
- HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. And then
- 23 EOG Resources?
- MR. PADILLA: Mr. Examiner, Ernest L. Padilla for
- 25 EOG Resources, and we are just here for the ride.

1 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. I think

- 2 that's all the entries that I have. Are there any other
- 3 entries of appearance for these cases that I have just
- 4 listed, 21489, 490, 491, 393, 394, 361, 362, 363, 364?
- 5 (No audible response.)
- 6 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Hearing none, these
- 7 cases, I believe, were a sort of kind of remand from the
- 8 Commission that we're having to try to sort out here.
- 9 And I guess I will start with you, Mr. Savage.
- 10 Where are we?
- 11 MR. SAVAGE: Thank you, Mr. Hearing Officer, yes,
- 12 it is a remand of the application.
- 13 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: You are a little
- 14 quiet.
- 15 MR. SAVAGE: Okay, I'm sorry. I believe it was a
- 16 remand from a de novo application with the OCC, and I will
- 17 give you an update of the current status. The closing with
- 18 Ascent, Matador's closing with Ascent was finalized and
- 19 successful. All of Ascent's ownership and interest in these
- 20 cases have been assigned now to Matador.
- 21 Ascent Energy is an entity that has no assets at
- 22 this point. Matador has promptly reached out to Mewbourne
- 23 and Apache. I have been informed that Matador's land team
- is scheduled to meet with Apache's land team next week.
- 25 Communication appears to have been productive -- are

1 productive, and negotiations are productive, and there may

- 2 be an opportunity to resolve these matters.
- 3 We will be filing a motion to make the transfer
- 4 of these proceedings from Ascent to Matador, and will be
- 5 withdrawing representation from Ascent. Because of these
- 6 developments, Matador is requesting a subsequent status
- 7 conference to see if such opportunity might come to
- 8 fruition, and the other parties can speak to this request as
- 9 it's being considered.
- 10 That's about, that's the update that I have on
- 11 the status of these cases from Matador's perspective.
- 12 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. Any sense
- 13 of when you would like to get back to us about this? In
- 14 other words, when do we schedule a status conference?
- 15 MR. SAVAGE: Matador was thinking about a month
- 16 from now, but that was depending on the availability of the
- 17 parties.
- 18 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. Okay. I
- 19 will turn to Mr. Debrine.
- MR. DEBRINE: Good morning, Mr. Examiner. We're
- 21 okay with Ascent's request for a status conference. I think
- 22 it makes sense to set one in April, on the April docket and
- 23 see where we are there.
- There are some questions with regard to whether
- 25 an operator can take over cases. This case -- the cases

1 were presented and evidence was submitted in advance of an

- 2 anticipated hearing with the idea that Ascent was going to
- 3 be operating the units, and all the parties' evidence was
- 4 directed to Ascent and the operatorship of course is a key
- 5 issue for the Division when considering competing cases.
- 6 So I don't know if you can just transfer it or if
- 7 new cases need to be filed, but we may be looking into that
- 8 and filing a motion, but we will save that for another day.
- 9 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: All right. Are you
- 10 okay with coming back in a month?
- 11 MR. DEBRINE: Yes. I think it makes sense to
- 12 come back in April and see where we are. Hopefully the
- 13 parties can resolve their differences and we won't have to
- 14 trouble the Division, but we will see how the negotiations
- 15 go.
- 16 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. I will
- 17 turn to Ms. Hardy.
- 18 MS. HARDY: Thank you, Mr. Examiner. I agree
- 19 that a status conference in a month or so is appropriate to
- 20 give the parties additional time to negotiate. I think
- 21 March or April would be fine with Mewbourne.
- 22 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Ms. Shaheen, any
- 23 position on this, your client? You are muted, I think.
- MS. SHAHEEN: Colgate was expecting this would
- 25 get pushed out by about a month, I don't know if they would

1 have an objection to it getting pushed out two months as

- 2 Mr. Debrine suggests, but they are not the applicant here,
- 3 so obviously we are taking a back seat.
- 4 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you.
- 5 Mr. Padilla, you said EOG has no concerns?
- 6 MR. PADILLA: No, we are just monitoring this
- 7 case.
- 8 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: And I will try again,
- 9 is Jalapeno Corporation here?
- 10 (No audible response.)
- 11 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: All right. Why don't
- we look for April 7 for a status conference?
- 13 (No audible response.)
- 14 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Are you okay with
- 15 that, Mr. Savage?
- 16 MR. SAVAGE: That should be fine.
- 17 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Mr. Debrine?
- MR. DEBRINE: Yes, that works.
- 19 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Ms. Hardy?
- MS. HARDY: Yes, that's fine, thank you.
- 21 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Good luck with all of
- that, and we will see you back here on April 7.
- MS. HARDY: Thank you.
