Partnership, n/k/a Targa Midstream Services LLC ("Targa"), as operator of the Versado Gas Processors, LLC, we are writing to request an extension of time through and including January 15, 2012, to drill the Monument AGI Well No. 1 and to commence injection operations as authorized by the Oil Conservation Division's Order No. R-13052 (the "Order"). The Oil Conservation Division issued the Order on November 18, 2008. Paragraph 15 of the Order provides that the "injection authority herein granted shall terminate one year after the effective date of this Order if the operator has not commenced injection operations pursuant hereto; provided however, the Division Director, upon written request of the operator received by the Division prior to the end of the one-year period of that injection, may extend this time for good cause."

On September 9, 2010, we submitted a written request to you for an extension of time pursuant to Paragraph 15 of the Order. We requested that extension on behalf of Targa allow Targa time to obtain all permits and approvals required under the terms of the Order and a January 5, 2010 settlement agreement between the New Mexico Environment Department and Targa. The settlement agreement with NMED requires Targa to install and commence operation of an acid gas injection well at its Monument plant by January 15, 2012. Targa has since worked diligently and has obtained the necessary permits and approvals from the NMED for the Monument well.
