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4 WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 1 2 9:00 a.m.: 3 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Let's to call the September 15th, 2005, meeting of the New Mexico Oil Conservation 4 Commission to order. 5 6 Let the record reflect that it's 9:00 a.m., that 7 we are meeting at the New Mexico Oil Conservation 8 Commission hearing room, Porter Hall, at 1220 South Saint 9 Francis, in Santa Fe, New Mexico. 10 To begin with, I'm going to introduce myself. Mv name is Mark Fesmire, I'm the Chairman of the Commission. 11 To my right is Commissioner Jami Bailey. 12 13 Commissioner Bailey is the designee of the State Land Commissioner. 14 15 To my left is Commissioner Frank Chavez. Commissioner Chavez is the appointee of the Energy, 16 17 Minerals and Natural Resources Secretary. 18 Also present is Commission secretary Florene Davidson. 19 20 And acting at least for part of the meeting this 21 morning as Commission secretary will be -- I mean 22 Commission counsel, will be Carol Leach. 23 And the record is being made by our court reporter, Mr. Steve Brennen [sic]. 24 25

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1	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: I guess the first order of
2	business is the reading of the minutes. Have the
3	Commissioners had the chance to review the minutes as
4	presented?
5	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Yes, I have, and I move
6	that we adopt them.
7	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: I second the motion.
8	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: The motion having been made
9	and seconded to adopt the minutes, all those in favor?
10	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Aye.
11	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Aye.
12	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Opposed?
13	Let the record reflect that the minutes as
14	presented by the Commission secretary will be adopted and
15	signed.
16	* * *
17	
18	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: The first matter to be
19	considered today is the request of Gandy Marley, Inc., a
20	request for review of the denial of the request for partial
21	stay of Division Order R-12,306-B in Case Number 13,480.
22	At this time no evidence or arguments will be received
23	are planned to be received by the Commission. Is that the
24	understanding of the parties present?
25	MR. FELDEWERT: Yes.

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1	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay. And at this time I'm
2	going to ask Counselor Brooks to give us a procedural
3	history of that case, if he would, please.
4	MR. BROOKS: Okay, thank you, Mr. Chairman,
5	honorable Commissioners. I am acting I have been acting
6	as Commission: counsel with respect to this case, and so I
7	will give the Commission the usual briefing on this matter.
8	I do not have the dates assembled but I recall
9	them in general terms, and I believe that the proceedings
10	in this matter began in March of 2005. It seems that the
11	Division raised a question about whether Gandy Marley,
12	Inc., had the authority under its existing Rule 711 waste
13	management facility permit to accept certain types of
14	wastes, that being salt-contaminated drilling fluids, that
15	it was accepting. And the Division sent a letter
16	indicating that they should cease doing so.
17	However, there was a feeling at that time that
18	there was a shortage of available facilities, and Gandy
19	Marley undertook to cooperate. I don't know the terms, but
20	in any event the Division decided to petition the Director,
21	or file an Application with the Director for an emergency
22	order to allow Gandy Marley to continue to accept salt-
23	contaminated drilling fluids as wastes, pending a hearing.
24	That application was granted in March of 2005.
25	Then in May of 2005 there was an Examiner Hearing

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1	on Gandy Marley, Inc.'s, Application to have its permit
2	amended so that it would have proper and permanent
3	authority to accept salt-contaminated waste.
4	In sometime this summer, and I don't remember
5	the date I believe it was in June, but I may be a little
6	bit off on that but anyway, the Division entered an
7	order pursuant to the hearing in May, and the terms I
8	think it was in August, actually, early August. The
9	Division entered an order. The order denied Gandy Marley's
10	permit without prejudice to refiling because of defects in
11	notice and I believe some other defects in the Application
12	itself.
13	The Division also at that time determined that
14	the emergency order should terminate and be superseded by
15	the Division's order pursuant to the full hearing that was
16	held in May.
17	Following the entry of that order, Gandy Marley,
18	Inc., filed a de novo application or an application for
19	de novo review by this Commission. At the same time or
20	shortly thereafter, Gandy Marley, Inc., also filed a motion
21	for stay of the order of the Commission. Now, Gandy or
22	the order of the Division pending action before the
23	Commission.
24	A reading of the entire text of Gandy Marley's
25	Application for a stay indicates that they are suggesting

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1	that the matter be stayed until their new Application is
2	filed and heard by the Commission, although their actual
3	prayer for relief only asks, I believe, that it be
4	postponed until the Commission's de novo review of the
5	Division's order, and I do not believe there is actually
6	before the Commission at this time an application to stay
7	the de novo proceeding pending the new application,
8	although they've indicated that that's the course that they
9	would like to pursue.
10	I'm describing the documents somewhat carefully,
11	because I'm not totally sure of how they would be
12	interpreted in that regard, but that's my interpretation.
13	You, Mr. Chairman, in your capacity as Director
14	of the Division, entered an order, as you will doubtless
15	recall, a few weeks ago denying Gandy Marley's request for
16	a stay pending the de novo hearing.
17	Gandy Marley filed an Application for review of
18	that issue before the Commission. I do not know, Mr.
19	Chairman, honorable Commissioners, if you wish me to give
20	you my advice concerning the legal aspects of such a
21	petition now or in executive session, so I will abide your
22	pleasure on that. I've reviewed the facts, and what is
23	before you now is the Application for stay pending the de
24	novo hearing, which is in effect an application for the
25	Commission to overrule the Director on that issue.

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I believe you have three options. One would be 1 to grant it and grant stay, the other would be to overrule 2 the motion and uphold the Director's denial of the stay, 3 and the third would be to set a hearing at some subsequent 4 5 time. I believe the matter cannot be heard today because 6 it was not on the docket for a hearing. 7 So thank you. I will be happy to give you my 8 legal view, either in public or in executive session at your convenience. 9 10 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Mr. Brooks, I would appreciate 11 legal advice to the Commission, probably be given in 12 executive session. MR. BROOKS: Very well. 13 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Counsel Leach, would this be a 14 good time to go into executive session and make that 15 decision? 16 MS. LEACH: Sure. 17 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay. At this time we will go 18 19 into executive session for the purposes of discussing the 20 motion before the Commission and for no other purposes. Isthere anything else that we need to put on the record 21 22 before we go into executive session? 23 MS. LEACH: As long as the other -- as long as you have two out of three votes --24 25 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay.

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MS. LEACH: -- you can go into executive session. 1 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: The Chair would entertain a 2 motion to go into executive session. 3 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I so move. 4 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: I second. 5 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: All those in favor? 6 7 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Aye. COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: 8 Aye. CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: At this time the Commission 9 will go into executive session to discuss this motion. 10 11 (Off the record at 9:11 a.m.) (The following proceedings had at 10:35 a.m.) 12 13 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: At this point we'll go back on the record. Let the record reflect that the Commission 14 came out of executive session at 10:35 on the date of the 15 meeting, and at this point the Chair would entertain a 16 motion concerning the deliberations on Cause Number 13,480. 17 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: I move that the Commission 18 19 grant the stay requested by the operator until the October 20 13th meeting, where the Commission will review the operator's progress, the Applicant's progress, in preparing 21 22 and publishing in accordance with Rule 711 their application for modification of their permit. At the 23 24 October 13th meeting, the Commission will determine whether 25 to extend this date, based on GMI's progress in application

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and notice.

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CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Is there a second? 2 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: 3 Second. CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: All those in favor? 4 5 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Aye. 6 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Ave. 7 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: All those opposed? Aye. 8 The motion carries. I'll direct Counsel to draft an order to that effect. 9 10 MR. BROOKS: Okay. Now, let me suggest in terms 11 of timing that we probably want this order entered today, 12 but we do have another matter to hear, so it would seem to 13 me to be appropriate that the Commission go ahead and deal 14 with the other matters and then take a recess to enable counsel to draft the order, and then convene later in the 15 16 day for the purpose of formally adopting the order if the 17 Commissioners' time and appointments permit. 18 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay, any objection? 19 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: No objection. 20 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: That's fine. 21 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: The next --22 MR. BROOKS: I would request a short break before 23 I have to testify. 24 (Laughter) 25

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1	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: The next cause before the
2	Commission is Case Number 13,482, in the matter of the
3	proposal of the Oil Conservation Commission on its own
4	motion to amend Oil Conservation Division Rules 1201, 1203
5	through 1205, 1207, 1208, 1211, 1212, 1214 and 1220.
6	We'll entertain appearances of counsel at this
7	time.
8	Is that you, Cheryl?
9	MS. BADA: That's me. Cheryl Bada for the
10	Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department, Oil
11	Conservation Division.
12	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay, are there any other
13	counsel present who are going to be involved today?
14	Ms. Bada, do you have any witnesses?
15	MS. BADA: No, we do not.
16	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Ms. Bada, I'll turn it over to
17	you at this time.
18	MS. BADA: I believe counsel for the Commission
19	has prepared an order for the Commission to adopt the
20	proposed Rules and attached as exhibits the repeal of the
21	current Rules and the replacement for those Rules, as well
22	as amendments to 19.5.1.7, which would include the two new
23	definitions, Commission clerk and Division clerk.
24	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay. And do you have a
25	suggestion at this time of what you're

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MS. BADA: I would recommend the Commission adopt 1 those rules as submitted. 2 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Have the Commissioners had the 3 opportunity to review the Rules as drafted? 4 5 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Yes, I have, and I intend 6 to sign the order. COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: I have, and I will also 7 sign the order. 8 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: And the Chair has done the 9 10 same, so at this time we'll entertain a motion to adopt the Rules as drafted. 11 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I move. 12 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: I second. 13 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: All those in favor? 14 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Aye. 15 16 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Aye. CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Opposed? Let the record 17 reflect that the motion carried and that the Rules will be 18 signed -- and that the Order adopting the Rules will be 19 20 signed at this time. That concludes the action that the Commission 21 needs to take on Case Number 13,482. 22 23 (Off the record at 10:40 a.m.) 24 (The following proceedings had at 1:37 p.m.) 25 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: We need to address a couple of

the grant for the

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administrative issues with respect to Case Number 13,480. 1 In the past we have drafted -- where there has 2 been a dissenting vote, we have drafted an order that 3 4 represents to the record that a majority of the 5 Commissioners have adopted this order, and I think that's a 6 good tradition. Would the Commissioners like to do that, 7 or would they rather have it drafted for the signature of the two Commissioners in the majority? 8

9 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: The reason why we 10 originally put it as the majority was because there were 11 several different issues that were addressed during that 12 case, and the order was very specific that a majority 13 agreed for certain portions, and the entire Commission 14 agreed for other portions. So that's the history on that 15 one.

This only deals with one issue, so it really doesn't make any difference to me. I just thought it was important to understand that it's critical in those areas where were have different factors, but for one factor it really doesn't matter.

CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay. Counsel, is there anyreason to draft it one way or the other?

23 MR. BROOKS: Not that I'm aware of.
24 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay. How long do you think
25 it will take you to draft an order?

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1	MR. BROOKS: Very difficult to really know. I
2	could say maybe a couple of hours, but unfortunately when I
3	get to drafting these things sometimes they take longer
4	than I think, so I just you know, it's hard to say. I
5	do have to first go back and refresh my recollection as to
6	exactly what was in the Division Order, so I know what
7	we're dealing with.
8	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay. Would the Commission
9	rather bet that Counsel drafts it today or set up another
10	procedure for getting it signed?
11	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Frank, do you have to go
12	back this afternoon?
13	COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Yes, I do, I have to leave
14	for Albuquerque tonight, because I'm leaving for Abilene
15	first thing in the morning, so I won't be available.
16	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I normally leave at 4:00,
17	but that's immaterial.
18	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: We're going to be gone from
19	tomorrow.
20	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: It was all figured out
21	John. We figured it all out.
22	MR. BEMIS: Oh, did you?
23	CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: If we'd a knowed we were going
24	to have an audience, we'd have waited for you.
25	Why don't I get counsel to draft the order and
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draft it in -- Well, I'm going to leave tomorrow morning. 1 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: So we need to sign it 2 3 tonight then. CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Well, if it's just the two of 4 5 you -- Are you going to be coming back through in the near future? 6 7 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: I wasn't intending to, no. 8 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Do we have to be in session to sign an order, or can the individual Commissioners --9 MR. BROOKS: I believe that we do. 10 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Do we? 11 12 MR. BROOKS: Yes, that's my understanding. 13 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: We can convene just a 14 quorum with Jami and myself, but we need a record. 15 MR. BROOKS: Yes, you could do that, two members of the Commission constitute a quorum. 16 17 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: And we do need a record on that. Do we need a record to sign the order? 18 19 MR. BROOKS: Yes. 20 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Would that help, Mark? 21 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Yeah, I mean especially if we 22 draft it so the -- that way. 23 When could you -- Can we do it next week 24 sometime? Or you -- you're not coming back, are you? 25 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: No.

COMMISSIONER BAILEY: No, it has to be this 1 afternoon or not for a long time, for Frank's schedule, 2 right? 3 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Pretty much. Monday, I may 4 5 be -- I may be available, but I'm not sure that it would be 6 Monday. CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay, could we overnight it to 7 him wherever he's at? 8 9 MR. BROOKS: We could do that. 10 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: But you said that they had to 11 be --COMMISSIONER BAILEY: It has to be in session. 12 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: -- in session. 13 MR. BROOKS: Well --14 15 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Can we take the session -now there are regulations that allow attendance by phone. 16 17 MR. BROOKS: Yes, there is a provision for that. COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: I can't physically sign it, 18 19 however --20 MR. BROOKS: Well, I suppose if you had to -- I 21 don't know. It's possible if you had a counterpart you 22 could sign it, if you were present by phone. I don't know. I don't think it's ever been done that way, and there's 23 24 nothing that deals with it specifically. 25 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Well, we'd better dot the

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i's --1 MR. BEMIS: I hope the underlying decision wasn't 2 this hard? 3 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Oh, it was harder. 4 5 (Laughter) 6 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: I'd be glad to --7 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: We were in executive 8 session --9 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: -- do it by telephone --COMMISSIONER BAILEY: -- for two hours. 10 11 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: -- except I physically can't sign the document. Now, I could approve it and then 12 physically sign it with overnight mail, if that -- or does 13 the signature have to be during the actual meeting? 14 MR. BROOKS: It says that -- I don't think that 15 it's real specific, I don't think it gets down to that 16 17 level of specificity. We have always interpreted it -- I don't remember the exact language, but we have always 18 19 interpreted it that the order has to be signed during a 20 Commission meeting. 21 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: And can we hold Commission 22 meetings by conference call? 23 MR. BROOKS: We can hold Commission meetings by 24 telephone. That's specifically provided. 25 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay. Well then, why don't we

let you draft the order, and then we'll call a special 1 meeting to sign it by conference call. 2 MR. BROOKS: Okay. 3 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: And you're going to be around? 4 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Yes, I'll be here --5 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Well, we'll be in Wyoming if 6 we don't get it done tomorrow. 7 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Yeah. 8 9 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay. 10 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: But I don't get there till Saturday. 11 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Well, if we don't get it done 12 tonight, I don't think we'll get it tomorrow, will we? 13 14 MR. BROOKS: Yeah, I think we can get it --COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: I'll be on the road 15 16 tomorrow. 17 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: So much for that. 18 MR. BROOKS: Yeah, so --19 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: But early next week we could do that? 20 21 MR. BROOKS: Well, yeah, I will be in Wyoming 22 next week but, you know, I can get the order done by then, 23 I would assume. 24 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay. Well, why don't we just 25 -- Frank, do you have a phone number where you'll be

available early next week? 1 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Yes. 2 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Why don't you leave it with 3 Florene and we'll get the order done, and we may have to 4 conduct most of the meeting from Wyoming and conference you 5 in and --6 MR. BROOKS: We'll have to figure out exactly how 7 8 we go about noticing the meeting. I will undertake to do 9 that. CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay, would we have to notice 10 a meeting for sign- -- yeah, I guess --11 12 MR. BROOKS: Whenever we have a meeting we have 13 to give notice. CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Can we continue this meeting? 14 MR. BROOKS: We can continue this meeting, that's 15 16 true. CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: To a time certain --17 MR. BROOKS: Yeah, that's the only trouble, it 18 19 has to be to a date and place specified. Of course, we 20 could deal with the place, I suppose, by having Florene 21 here with a conference telephone and plugging everybody in, wherever they were, and then anybody that came here could 22 23 hear what happened, but that -- we do have to have a date, 24 time and place specified to continue this up to --25 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay, Frank, are you going to

be someplace Friday where you'll be around a phone? 1 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: 2 Tomorrow? CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: No, a week from tomorrow. 3 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Yes. 4 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Are you going to be --5 6 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I'll be in town. CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Why don't we just continue 7 8 this meeting until Friday morning, nine o'clock, in Porter Hall --9 10 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Before we do that, would 11 the order be much different than this particular one? MR. BROOKS: It's going to have to be somewhat 12 13 different from that. That's the one that refuses the stay, right? 14 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: That's right. 15 MR. BROOKS: It's going to have to be somewhat 16 different than that because if you're going to have to --17 18 in the first place, we grant the stay, but also, I assume, we want to give reasons, especially since the Commission is 19 20 divided. And furthermore, we've got to put the conditions 21 in. 22 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Okay, very good. 23 MR. BROOKS: So it is going to be more complex. 24 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: I see, yeah, exactly. 25 Continuing it to Friday would be fine.

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CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay, and you can conference 1 in? 2 3 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Yes. CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: And Jami and I will be here. 4 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Okay, Friday at 9:00. 5 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Friday at nine o'clock. 6 7 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: Could we make that --8 sorry, Friday at 10:00? 9 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Friday at 10:00? MR. BROOKS: That is Friday, September the 23rd? 10 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: 11 Uh-huh. 12 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay, and we need to --13 Anything else? Oh, we need to make sure that the Applicant 14 understands that the new order doesn't take effect until 15 signed, until the Commission's order is signed. So the 16 stay will be in effect until the new order is signed. 17 Anything else? 18 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: That's it. 19 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: The Chair would entertain a motion for -- dismissal is not the right word --20 21 adjournment. 22 COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ: I so move. 23 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Second. 24 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: All those in favor? 25 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Aye.
