Gentlemen:

Reference is made to the above captioned unit covering lands located in Eddy County, New Mexico. Richardson & Bass, as Unit Operator, advise that from the available information, a valuable and commercial discovery of unitized substances has been made on committed land within the unit area; and they hereby request that a participating area be established.

In this connection we attach hereto as part of this application for a participating area, a map marked "Exhibit A," which reflects the outline of the unit, together with all of the wells which have been drilled to date. We have shown, outlined in red on the map, the proposed participating area; and we have also designated the other wells which have been drilled on the unit. We also attach "Exhibit B" which is a schedule of the initial participating area.

You will note from the map that there have been a total of 18 wells drilled within the unit; and on March 29, 1960, the Ralph Lowe No. 1 Richardson & Bass Federal was completed in the $NE\frac{1}{4}$ $NE\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 18, Township 25 South, Range 30 East, as a Delaware discovery. The well was drilled to a total depth of 3,666 feet. It was perforated from 3,643 to 3,649 feet; and after being washed with mud acid, the well was completed naturally, flowing 70 barrels of oil in 14 hours through a 20/64 inch choke. Various tests run since the completion date reflect that the well is capable of flowing a much larger potential, as the flowing tubing pressure is 325 pounds through a 20/64 inch choke. The logs run on the well reflect an estimated 64 feet of gross pay, with a net pay of 28 feet. The gravity of the crude is 42 degrees. This well has been granted an United States Geological Survey Commissioner of Public Lands Oil Conservation Commission

allowable of 1,000 barrels per month; and during the month of April, they produced 1,357 barrels of oil, whereas up to the 23rd of May the well produced 852 barrels of oil.

Since the completion of this initial well, Ralph Lowe has drilled a confirmation well located in the $SW_4^1 SW_4^1$ of Section 8, Township 25 South, Range 30 East. This well was drilled to a total depth of 3,692 feet; and the logs reflect that the well cut an estimated 66 feet of gross pay, with 30 feet of net pay. After perforating, the well was washed with mud acid and completed naturally on May 27, 1960, for an estimated 3 barrels of oil per hour flowing through an 18/64 inch choke. Ralph Lowe has commenced a third well which is located in the $NW_4^1 NW_4^1$ of Section 17, Township 25 South, Range 30 East, which is designated as No. 2 Poker Lake. This well is presently at a total depth of 3,708 feet and is being logged in preparation of casing being run. From the core data, it appears that this well has cut approximately 40 feet of sand; and it is anticipated that the first enlargement of the initial participating area will be made shortly to include this well.

As Unit Operator, we hereby respectfully submit that a participating area of 40 acres be established in accordance with the terms and provisions of the Poker Lake Unit Agreement. We anticipate the filing of an acceptable plan of development providing for further exploration on the unit very shortly.

The recently completed well is known as the Ralph Lowe No. 1-X Richardson & Bass Federal, located 610 from the north and 614 from the west of

Section 17, Township 25 South, Range 30 East. This well was spudded on June 1, 1960, and drilled to a total depth of 3608 feet. The top of the Delaware pay was encountered at 3660 feet, and the well was plugged back to a depth of 3684 feet. After being perforated from 3662-69 feet and acidized with 500 gallons of acid, the well was completed for an initial production of 50 BOPD plus an undetermined amount of salt water. This well was completed on June 23, 1960. The following is the production, by months, since completion of the well:

This well is an extention of the Delaware pay encountered in the No. 1 Richardson & Bass Federal completed in the NE_4^1 NE_4^1 of Section 18 in said township. As can be seen from the above production, we feel that the well is capable of draining the additional 40 acres requested herein.

An additional well, known as the Ralph Lowe No. 1 Poker Lake State, was drilled outside the unit area in the $SW_4^1 SW_4^1$ of Section 8, Township 25 South, Range 30 East. This well was spudded May 13, 1960, and drilled to a total depth of 3692 feet. The well was perforated from 3673-80 feet and was completed on May 27, 1960, for 76 BOPD plus 6% salt water.
