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Page 2 1 (8:18 a.m.) EXAMINER EZEANYIM: Good morning, 2 3 everybody. I will call this hearing to order. Before we proceed, I have to do some little 4 5 introductions. Of course, everybody knows our legal 6 examiner, Mr. David Brooks. My name is Richard 7 Ezeanyim. And we have a new hearing examiner, actually 8 a technical examiner. His name is Phillip Goetze. He 9 joined us about two weeks ago. So he's going to be 10 conducting the hearings as soon as we get him 11 up-to-date. 12 Now, a couple of announcements. The reason 13 I wanted to say this is that I get calls all the time. 14 If we continue a case by the Division's volition, that 15 we decided to continue a case for one reason or another, 16 it doesn't count against the operator in lieu of the 17 three continuances, you know, the policy that we have. 18 So let's say the OCD, for one reason or the other, continues a case. It won't count against that operator 19 who is the applicant or the operator. I don't know how 20 that works. But as you know, we have a 21 three-continuances policy. After three continuances, 22 the case is dismissed without prejudice, according to 23 the lawyers, and they can, you know, re-apply. So, you 24 know, unless it's really -- because you wanted to hear 25

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1 the case, but we continued it for one reason or the 2 other. So I hope I don't get those calls anymore. When 3 somebody says, If you continue a case, will it count 4 against me, the answer is no.

Now, again, when I go through these cases, 5 the operator may mention the formation. For example --6 7 take, for example, the Glorieta Formation. Can you imagine how many pools are in there? There are a lot of 8 pools in the Glorieta-Yeso Formation, or the Bone Spring 9 Formation or whatever formation you are talking about. 10 So the point I'm making is, try to give the name of the 11 particular pool you are talking about, because sometimes 12 I want to look at that pool to see if it has a special 13 14 pool rule, or if it is a temporary pool. But when you mention the Yeso Formation, it is important for me to 15 16 see which pool you are producing from, and if I don't see it, you know, it may not help me to get ready for 17 what's going on, to find out whether that pool has a 18 19 special pool rule I can look at and see what you are 20 asking or if it depends on the statewide rules, too. 21 I mean, I'm pleading to you guys to try to specify which pool, especially in these compulsory 22 23 pooling orders. If you have your pool, "the Yeso 24 Formation," or the pools, a particular pool, you can 25 include the pool code, if necessary. If not, I can find

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Page 4 it for you. But if you give me the particular pool, we 1 2 will really appreciate it, in your advertisement, in your applications and everything that we read before we 3 come to the hearing. 4 5 Now we are going to go to the docket today. It's going to be a simple docket, as you can see. And 6 for today, February 21st, 8:15 a.m. in the morning, I am 7 going to call Docket Number 7-13. First off, I'll read 8 off all the continuances and dismissals and get them out 9 10 of the way, of course. 11 We start with page 1. Case Number 14956 is continued to March 7th. Case Number 14957 is continued 12 to March 7th. 13 14 Page 2. Case Number 14959 is continued to 15 March 7th. I think Case Number 14937 had three 16 continuances, and lately, I think, it was canceled for 17 18 the applicant, dismissed it. So if he didn't dismiss 19 it, we could have dismissed it without prejudice 20 according to the three-continuances policy. So Case Number 14937 is dismissed. 21 On page 3, Case Number 14948 is continued 22 23 to March 19th. 24 If you notice, March 19th is not a Division 25 This case has been moved to the Commission hearing.
