# FRONTIER FIELD SERVICES, LLC'S PRE-HEARING STATEMENT

Frontier Field Services, LLC ("Frontier") submits its Pre-Hearing Statement as required by the Oil Conservation Commission.

# **APPEARANCES**

Frontier is the applicant in this case. Its business address is 4200 E. Skelly Drive, #700, Tulsa, Oklahoma 74135. It is represented by the undersigned counsel.

Frontier has been informed that the Oil Conservation Division ("Division") will enter an appearance. The Division will be represented by Gabrielle A. Gerholt.

#### STATEMENT OF THE CASE

On August 11, 2011, the Division issued Order No. R-13443, which authorizes Frontier to inject treated acid gas ("TAG") containing hydrogen sulfide ("H<sub>2</sub>S") and carbon dioxide from Frontier's Maljamar Natural Gas Processing Plant into its Maljamar AGI #1 well. The Maljamar AGI #1 well is located in Section 21, Township 17 South, Range 32 East in Lea County, approximately three (3) miles south of Maljamar. Order No. R-13443 authorizes Frontier to

dispose of TAG in the Lower Leonard and Wolfcamp Formations in injection intervals between 9,300 feet and 10,000 feet.

Order No. R-13443 enumerates certain conditions, including requirements that Frontier: (1) ensure that eight identified offset wells that are located within a 1.5 mile radius of the Maljamar AGI #1 well, as well as any later-completed wells within the same radius that penetrate the permitted injection interval, are equipped with H<sub>2</sub>S flags or other safety indicators; and (2) plug any offset well within the 1.5 mile radius whose level of H<sub>2</sub>S exceeds 100 ppm.

Frontier recently completed the Maljamar AGI #1 well, but has not yet commenced the injection of TAG. It will utilize only the Wolfcamp Formation to dispose of TAG, from approximately 9,570 feet to 10,130 feet below ground surface. As required by Order R-13443, Frontier has placed H<sub>2</sub>S warning signs on the eight offset wells identified in the order. Frontier also has tested the H<sub>2</sub>S levels in the offset wells, all of which are owned by other operators and are currently being operated to economically produce oil and gas and to dispose of sour produced water. Five of the offset wells have H<sub>2</sub>S levels that exceed 100 ppm, even though Frontier has not yet commenced the injection of TAG.

On January 11, 2013, Frontier filed its Motion to Amend Order No. R-13443. Because Frontier has determined that it will not utilize the secondary injection interval in the Lower Leonard Formation, the motion requests that the Commission amend Order No. R-13443 by lowering the uppermost elevation of the permitted injection interval from approximately 9,300 feet to approximately 9,550 feet. The motion also requests the Commission to amend Order No. R-13443 by eliminating the requirement that Frontier plug any offset wells whose H<sub>2</sub>S levels exceed 100 ppm. The wells are owned by other operators, and plugging them would result in waste and impair the operators' correlative rights.
