Re: Case 13451 – Revocation of Administrative Permit SWD-966


Dear Mr. Catanach:

Lynx has recently been offered disposal capacity into an existing system by one of our offset operators that might eliminate the need for us to convert the Jones 'B' No. 3, the subject of SWD-966, to a disposal well. We are currently in the process of trying to secure the required Federal surface flowline permits as this option would be much more economical than developing our own well. The timing for this project is such that it will be approximately 60 to 90 days before we will know whether SWD-966 will even be needed. The question is one of adequate capacity being available in the existing well.

Contesting the proposed revocation involves considerable time and expense that I would prefer to avoid if the above option proves to be viable. I am concerned, however, that not contesting and having the order revoked would leave me with a higher mountain to climb in the event that re-application becomes necessary. Your thoughts on how best to proceed would be greatly appreciated. In the meantime, I am requesting that the hearing currently scheduled for April 21 be continued to the second hearing date in June. Thanks in advance for your consideration.
