APPLICATION OF COG OPERATING LLC TO RE-OPEN CASE NO. 15185 TO
AMEND THE WELL SURFACE LOCATION AND WELL NAME UNDER ORDER
R-13913, LEA COUNTY, NEW MEXICO.

CASE NO. 15185 (re-opened)

APPLICATION

COG OPERATING LLC, ("COG") through its undersigned attorneys, hereby makes application to the Oil Conservation Division to amend the surface location and well name in Order R-13913. In support of its application, COG states:

1. Under Division Order R-13913 entered October 21, 2014, the Division created a 160-acre non-standard spacing and proration unit in the Yeso formation (West Maljamar-Yeso (pool code 44500)) consisting of the W/2W/2 of Section 15, Township 17 South, Range 32 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico and pooled certain uncommitted mineral interest owners in this spacing and proration unit ("the Unit").

2. Under Order R-13913, the Unit was dedicated to COG's proposed **Ivar the Boneless Fed. No. 1H Well** (API No. Pending), which was originally planned to be drilled as a horizontal well at a surface location 370 feet from the South line and 380 feet from the West line (Unit M) of Section 10 to a standard terminus 330 feet from the South line and 330 feet from the West line (Unit M) of Section 15.

3. Since the entry of Order R-13913, COG has changed the proposed surface location of the initial well. This well will now be drilled as a horizontal well from a surface location 75 feet from the North line and 330 feet from the West line (Unit D) of Section 22 to a standard terminus 330 feet from the North line and 330 feet from the West line (Unit D) of Section 15.

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
4. In addition, COG has changed the name of the proposed well from Ivar the Boneless Federal Well No. 1H to Ivar the Boneless Federal Well No. 11H.

5. The completed interval for the proposed well has not changed.

WHEREFORE, COG Operating LLC requests that this application be set for hearing before an Examiner of the Oil Conservation Division on April 30, 2015, and, after notice and hearing as required by law, the Division amend existing order R-13913 to reflect the correct surface location and well name for the dedicated well.

CASE 15185 (re-opened): **Application of COG Operating LLC To Re-Open Case No. 15185 To Change The Well Surface Location and Well Name Under The Terms Of Compulsory Pooling Order R-13913, Lea County, New Mexico.** Applicant in the above-styled cause seeks to amend Division Order R-13913 to reflect the revised surface location and well name for the initial well to be dedicated to the 160-acre oil spacing and proration unit created by Order R-13913. The spacing unit consists of the W/2W/2 of Section 15, Township 17 South, Range 32 East, Lea County, New Mexico, NMPM. Said unit will now be dedicated to the applicant's proposed Ivar the Boneless Federal No. 11H Well to be drilled from a surface location 75 feet from the North line and 330 feet from the West line (Unit D) of Section 22 to a standard terminus 330 feet from the North line and 330 feet from the West line (Unit D) of Section 15. The completed interval will commence in Section 15 and remain within the standard setback required by the Division's rules. The subject area is located approximately 1 mile south of Maljamar, New Mexico.
