

LCX Energy, LLC has made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division for relief in the following matter: Case _____ Application of LCX Energy, LLC For Compulsory Pooling, Eddy County, New Mexico. Applicant seeks an order pooling all mineral interests from the surface to the base of the Wolfcamp formation underlying the W/2 of Section 31, Township 16 South, Range 25

East, NMPM, Eddy County, New Mexico, to form a standard 320-acre gas spacing and proration unit for any and all formations and or pools developed on 320-acres, including but not necessarily limited to the Wolfcamp formation. Said units are to be dedicated to Applicant's proposed 1625 Fed Com No. 311 Well drilled from a surface location 660' from the South line and 1880' from the West line to a bottom hole location 660' from the North line and 1880' from the West line of said Section 31. This Application is brought pursuant to the provisions of 19.15.14.1207 A.(1)(b) NMAC. Applicant has been unable to locate the Heirs of E. L. Booth (addresses unknown) who are interests owners of the operating rights referenced above.

Also to be considered will be the cost of drilling and completing the well and the allocation of the cost thereof, the actual operating costs and charges for supervision, designation of applicant as operator and a charge for risk involved in drilling the well. The lands that are the subject of the application are located approximately 6 miles northwest of Artesia, New Mexico. This application will be set for hearing before a Division Examiner on June 22, 2006, at the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division, 1220 South St. Francis Dr., Santa Fe, New Mexico. Any owner of an interest that may be affected may appear and present testimony. Failure to appear at that time and become a party of record will preclude such party from challenging this application at a later time.
