WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 2:53 p.m.:

EXAMINER BROOKS: Okay, at this time we'll call Case Number 13,854, Application of Myco Industries, Inc., for compulsory pooling, Chaves County, New Mexico.

MR. BRUCE: Mr. Examiner, Jim Bruce of Santa Fe, representing the Applicant. I'm submitting this case by affidavit.

MS. MUNDS-DRY: Mr. Examiner, Ocean Munds-Dry with the law firm of Holland and Hart, here representing Spiral, Incorporated. We have no witnesses. We are working on an agreement with Myco, just simply entering our appearance.

EXAMINER BROOKS: Very good, you may proceed.

MR. BRUCE: Well, Mr. Examiner, since Ms. Dry was talking about horizontal Wolfcamp wells, I'll continue the trend, because that's what this is about.

Submitted as Exhibit 1 is the statement of Shari Hodges who is a landman for Myco Industries. They are seeking to force pool the Wolfcamp formation underlying the south half of Section 32, 15 South, 25 East, to form a -- this is supposed to be a gas well, and it would be a 320-acre spacing unit under Division Rules -- for its Alfalfa 32 Fee Well Number 1. It is a horizontal well, as you can see from Exhibit A, attached to this exhibit.

5 The landman's statement of course requests the 1 risk charge and sets forth the overhead charges. 2 EXAMINER BROOKS: Requesting unitization -- or 3 pooling in the Wolfcamp only? 4 MR. BRUCE: Yes. 5 EXAMINER BROOKS: Okay. 6 MR. BRUCE: Exhibit B attached to the affidavit 7 lists the people being pooled and their interests. You can 8 see that less than four percent of the -- or approximately 9 4 or 4 1/4 percent of the well unit is being pooled. 10 are dozens upon dozens of interest owners in this well 11 unit, and they've tried to track them down. Some of them 12 are unlocatable. 13 Exhibit --14 EXAMINER BROOKS: It's an interesting name here, 15 Margaret Old Carr. 16 MR. BRUCE: Yeah, maybe we ought to name Mr. Carr 17 William Old Carr. 18 19 (Laughter) EXAMINER BROOKS: We'll raise that next time we 20 have the opportunity. 21 22

MR. BRUCE: Attached as Exhibit C is the correspondence that went to the locatable people. been contacts with these people.

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And Exhibit D is the AFE for the well. Similar

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to the Parallel cases, this is about a 5200-foot well, 1 4500, 5000 feet, and the AFE is about \$2.2 million. 2 EXAMINER BROOKS: And I'm sure it's fair and 3 reasonable. 4 I could retire on it. MR. BRUCE: 5 And submitted as Exhibit 2 is my affidavit of 6 notice to the locatable parties. 7 And then Exhibit 3 is an affidavit of 8 publication. When you look at the affidavit of 9 publication, there were -- there are a number of people on 10 this list who we do not seek to force pool, people who were 11 located -- and by the way, Parallel Petroleum is a working 12 interest owner in this well and is taking part in the well. 13 The reason I overnoticed in the advertisement is, 14 I never know anymore who's locatable and who's not when I 15 file the Application, so I've started --16 EXAMINER BROOKS: Yes. 17 18 MR. BRUCE: -- overnotifying by publication. the unlocatables were mentioned in there. 19 20 EXAMINER BROOKS: Okay, you've got -- let's see, 21 you've got Timothy Bayer; and you've got Dennis Colclough; 22 and you've got NRLL, Inc.; you've got Don Darden; and Kerry 23 Brister; Mitzi Brister; Raford Brister; and Western

Commerce Bank, Trustee -- Elaine Flint, deceased, Western

Commerce Bank, Trustee -- I was going to say, I wouldn't

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expect to find a return receipt from somebody deceased --1 and Keith Darden, you didn't get a return --2 MR. BRUCE: I did not. But Mr. Examiner, I'm 3 glad you mention that. I did want to dismiss them. 4 think they've tracked -- Myco informed me they tracked them 5 down and have reached agreement with them, so --6 EXAMINER BROOKS: Okay. 7 MR. BRUCE: -- Keith Darden was... 8 EXAMINER BROOKS: And Joe Meers, not located? 9 MR. BRUCE: Well, he was locatable. As a matter 10 11 of fact, the Exhibit 1 -- I think there's information in there that FedEx's were send to him, but he obviously 12 didn't pick up his --13 EXAMINER BROOKS: Yeah, you have these track-and-14 confirm notices --15 16 MR. BRUCE: Yeah. 17 EXAMINER BROOKS: -- on Joe Meers and Rique 18 Brister, and I'm not familiar with that procedure at the post office. 19 MR. BRUCE: It is simply going to the U.S. Postal 20 Service website --21 22 EXAMINER BROOKS: Okay. 23 MR. BRUCE: -- and you plug in the -- what is it? 24 15-digit number, and it tells you. And eventually the green card shows up, and I'd be glad to submit those after 25

19	You have a copy?	
20	COURT REPORTER: Yes, sir.
