APPLICATION OF SUNLIGHT EXPLORATION, INC. FOR COMPULSORY POOLING, LEA COUNTY, NEW MEXICO.

APPLICATION

Sunlight Exploration, Inc. applies for an order pooling all mineral interests from the surface to the base of the Wolfcamp formation underlying the NW1/NW1/ of Section 14, Township 13 South, Range 38 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico, and in support thereof, states:

- Applicant is the operator of the NW\nw\u00e4 of Section 14, 1. and has the right to re-enter or drill a well thereon.
- 2. Applicant proposes to re-enter the V. Linam Well No. 1, located 660 feet from the north and west lines of Section 14, and seeks to dedicate the NW¼NW¼ of Section 14 to the well for all pools or formations developed on 40 acre spacing, including the Bronco-Wolfcamp Pool.
- Applicant has in good faith sought to obtain the 3. voluntary joinder of all other mineral interest owners in the NWWNW of Section 14 for the purposes set forth herein.
- Although applicant attempted to obtain voluntary agreements from all mineral interest owners to participate in the re-entry and drilling of the well or to otherwise commit their interests to the well, certain interest owners have failed or refused to join in dedicating their interests. applicant seeks an order pooling all mineral interest owners in the NW¼NW¼ of Section 14, pursuant to NMSA 1978 §70-2-17.

5. The pooling of all mineral interests underlying the NW½NW½ of Section 14 will prevent the drilling of unnecessary wells, prevent waste, and protect correlative rights.

WHEREFORE, Applicant requests that, after notice and hearing, the Division enter its order:

- A. Pooling all mineral interests in the NW1/NW1/4 of Section
- 14, from the surface to the base of the Wolfcamp formation;
- B. Designating applicant as operator of the well;
- C. Considering the cost of re-entering, drilling, and completing the well, and allocating the cost thereof among the well's working interest owners;
- D. Approving actual operating charges and costs charged for supervision, together with a provision adjusting those rates as provided in the COPAS accounting procedure;
- E. Setting a charge for the risk involved in re-entering, drilling, and completing the well in the event a working interest owner elects not to participate in the well; and
- F. Granting such further relief as the Division deems proper.
