PROPOSED ORDER OF THE DIVISION

BY THE DIVISION:

This case came on for hearing on June 11, 2009 at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner

NOW, on this _____ th day of June 2009, the Division Director, having considered the record and the recommendations of the Examiner,

FINDS THAT:

(1) Due public notice has been given, and the Division has jurisdiction of this case and its subject matter.

(2) The applicant, Marbob Energy Corporation, seeks approval of its SRO State Exploratory Unit Agreement for all oil and gas in all formations underlying the following-described 8320 acres, more or less, of state lands in Eddy County, New Mexico:

- (3) Applicant presented testimony that demonstrates that:
 - (a) All working interest owners in the Unit area have been afforded an opportunity to commit their interests to the Unit Agreement and working interest owners representing 92% of the working interest ownership in the Unit Area is committed to the Unit Agreement. No working interest owner has declined to commit its interest and may still do so.
 - (b) The royalty interest ownership in the proposed SRO State Exploratory Unit is 100% State of New Mexico lands;
 - (c) There are no overriding royalty interest in the Unit Area;
 - (d) The Commissioner of Public Lands has given preliminary approval for the proposed Unit;
 - (e) Sufficient working interest and royalty interest within the Unit area has been voluntarily committed to afford effective control of unit operations pursuant to the Unit Plan;
 - (f) The primary target for the initial test well will be the Bone Spring formation, but all formations will be evaluated down to the base of the Bone Spring formation.

(4) No interested party appeared or otherwise objected to the proposed unit agreement.

(5) The approval of the proposed unit agreement will serve to prevent waste and protect correlative rights within the lands assigned to the unit area.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

(1) The SRO State Exploratory Unit Agreement is hereby approved for all oil and gas in all formations underlying the following-described 8320 acres, more or less, of state lands in Eddy County, New Mexico:

(2) The plan contained in the SRO State Exploratory Unit Agreement for the development and operation of the above-described unit area is hereby approved in principle; provided, however, notwithstanding any of the provisions contained in the unit agreement, this approval shall not be considered as waiving or relinquishing, in any manner, any right, duty, or obligation that is now, or may hereinafter be, vested in the Division to supervise and control operations for the unit and production of oil and gas there from.

(3) The unit operator shall file with the Division an executed original or executed counterpart of the unit agreement within 30 days of the effective date thereof; in the event of subsequent joinder by any other party, or expansion or contraction of the unit area, the unit operator shall file with the Division, within 30 days thereafter, copies of the unit agreement reflecting the subscription of those interests having joined or ratified.

(4) All: (i) plans of development and operation; (ii) creations, expansions or contractions of participating areas; and (iii) expansions or contractions of the unit area shall be submitted to the Division Director for approval.

(5) This order shall become effective upon approval of the unit agreement by the Commissioner of Public Lands for the State of New Mexico. This order shall terminate upon the termination of the unit agreement. The last unit operator shall notify the Division immediately in writing of such termination.

(6) Jurisdiction of this case is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Division may deem necessary.
