Page 3 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Let's go on the record. 1 The record should reflect that this is the Wednesday, 2 April 15th, 2009 special meeting of the Oil Conservation 3 Commission. The meeting has been called to address two 4 cases, but prior to calling those two cases, we have the 5 matter of the minutes from the April 2nd, 2009 Commission 6 7 meeting. Have the commissioners had the opportunity to review the minutes as presented by the secretary? 8 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Yes, I have, and I 9 10 move that we adopt the corrected edition. 11 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Madam Secretary, the version presented this morning has the corrections from 12 13 the last --14 MS. DAVIDSON: Yes. 15 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Commissioner Olson, have you had a chance to see the --16 17 COMMISSIONER OLSON: Yeah. I made a 18 couple of corrections. I'm assuming that those are in there. 19 20 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Those are the ones she's talking about. 21 22 COMMISSIONER OLSON: I'll second that. 23 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: So there's a motion 24 before the Commission to adopt the minutes as presented by the secretary. All those in favor signify by saying 25

Page 4 1 aye. Let the record reflect that the Commission has 2 unanimously adopted the minutes of the April 2nd meeting. 3 They will be signed by the Chairman and conveyed to the 4 secretary for recording.

5 One more housekeeping matter. The record 6 should also reflect that Commissioners Bailey, Olson and 7 Fesmire are all present. We, therefore, have a quorum.

The first case before the Commission is Case 8 Number 14255. It's the reopened application of the New 9 Mexico Oil Conservation Commission through its 10 Environmental Bureau Chief for an adoption of an 11 12 amendment to 19.15.39 NMAC adding new sections to be codified at 19.15.39.9 and 19.15.39.10 NMAC addressing 13 special provisions for Santa Fe County and the Galisteo 14 Basin, Santa Fe, Sandoval and San Miguel Counties, New 15 16 Mexico.

We did have a question with the notice that the staff has already addressed, but we do need to put it on the record. Counsel Bada, would you like to explain that for the record, please?

MS. BADA: We had some scheduling problems and notice wasn't published in the New Mexico Register, so the hearing will have to be continued until notice is, in fact, published in the Register and the newspapers. CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: And that will be

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Page 5 1 addressed by May 27th of this year? MS. BADA: I believe that's when the new 2 3 notice has the hearing scheduled for. 4 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Okay. So what we'll need to do is continue that case until May 27th? 5 MS. BADA: Basically, it will have to be 6 7 reopened on the 27th since we didn't perfect notice. 8 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Thank you, Counsel. Is there any question concerning that case? 9 10 MS. FOSTER: Mr. Chairman, I do have a 11 question -- Karin Foster on behalf of the Independent Petroleum Association -- concerning that case. 12 I am a party of record in that case. My understanding is that 13 it is going to be reopened. Will there be additional 14 15 witnesses to testify for that hearing? CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: No. 16 It will be reopened for deliberations. The evidentiary phase has 17 already been closed. 18 19 MS. FOSTER: Okay. Thank you. 20 MS. BADA: Actually, there will be 21 witnesses. According to the Division's pre-hearing statement, it will be Theresa or Florene for the notice, 22 and Daniel Sanchez. 23 24 CHAIRMAN FESMIRE: Oh, I stand corrected. 25 There will be evidentiary proceedings in that case on the

Page 6 1 27th. MS. FOSTER: Would it be necessary for us, 2 as parties to the case, if we feel necessary, to file a 3 statement should we want to have rebuttal witnesses to 4 5 the testimony? MS. BADA: The deadline for that, I 6 7 believe, has passed in the Order that was issued by the Chair last month. I don't remember the exact date. 8 MS. FOSTER: But the rebuttal witnesses to 9 this additional testimony -- I don't expect any --10 MS. BADA: Right. 11 12 MS. FOSTER: -- but maybe we can talk about it off line. The next cause before the Commission is Case 21 Number 14292, the application of the New Mexico Oil 22 Conservation Division for adoption of the amendments to 23 Rule 19.15.17 (the "Pit Rule") statewide. The transcript 24 was made available on the website on the 13th? 25
