AFFIDAVIT OF NOTICE

My name is Theresa Duran-Saenz, and I am a Legal Assistant with the Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department. I hereby certify that notice of Case 14255 was given as follows:

- 1. The Oil Conservation Division (OCD) filed the Application in rulemaking Case 14255 on November 10, 2008. The application includes the proposed amendments to 19.15.39 NMAC.
- 2. Division Director Mark Fesmire issued the Notice of Rulemaking in Case 14255 on November 10, 2008. The notice provides that Case 14255 will be heard December 11, 2008. The Notice used language proposed by the OCD in its application. Regarding the filing of recommended modifications, the Notice correctly stated:

"Any person recommending modifications to a proposed rule change shall, no later than **Monday**, **November 24**, **2008**, file a notice of recommended modifications with Ms. Davidson including the text of the recommended modifications, an explanation of the modifications' impact, and the reasons for adopting the modifications."

However, the Notice also included "notice of recommended modifications" in the list of filings that must be received by December 3, 2008. A copy of the Notice is attached as Exhibit A.

- 3. To clarify the due date for filing recommended modifications, Division Director Mark Fesmire issued a revised Notice of Rulemaking in Case 14255 on November 17, 2008. The revised Notice removed "notice of recommended modifications" from the list of filings that must be received by December 3, 2008. A copy of the revised Notice is attached as Exhibit B.
- 4. <u>19.15.3.9(A)(1) NMAC</u> requires that the notice be published one time in a newspaper of general circulation in the counties that the proposed rule change affects no less than 20 days prior to the scheduled hearing date. The proposed rule change in Case 14255 affects Santa Fe, Sandoval and San Miguel Counties.
 - The Santa Fe New Mexican is a newspaper of general circulation in Santa Fe, Sandoval and San Miguel Counties. On November 18, 2008 I e-mailed the revised notice of hearing to The Santa Fe New Mexican. Exhibit C is a copy of the affidavit of publication from the Santa Fe New Mexican, showing publication of the revised Notice on November 19, 2008.
 - The Las Vegas Optic is a newspaper of general circulation in San Miguel County. On November 12, 2008 I e-mailed the original Notice to the Las Vegas Optic. On November 12, 2008, the Las Vegas Optic confirmed receipt of the Notice and scheduled publication for November 14, 2008. Exhibit D is a copy of the invoice from the Las Vegas Optic, with a copy of the original Notice showing publication on November 14, 2008. I did not send the revised Notice to the Las Vegas

- Optic because the original Notice had already published, and the revised notice would not be published timely by this newspaper.
- The Observer is a newspaper of general circulation in Sandoval County. On November 17, 2008, I e-mailed the revised Notice to the Observer. I have been informed that The Observer did not publish the notice until six days later, on November 23, 2008. The OCD has not yet received an affidavit of publication from the Observer.
- 5. <u>19.15.3.9.A(2) NMAC</u> requires that the notice be published on the applicable Oil Conservation Commission (OCC) docket and that the clerk send the docket by regular or electronic mail not less than 20 days prior to the hearing to all who have requested such notice. The docket and the revised Notice were posted on November 19, 2008 and sent that day by electronic mail to those individuals who requested such notice, and to those individuals who requested notice of rulemaking. See Exhibits E (the docket) and F (the revised Notice), attached.
- 6. <u>19.15.3.9.A(3) NMAC</u> requires that the notice be published one time in the New Mexico Register, with the publication date not less than 10 business days prior to the scheduled hearing date. The revised Notice was published in the New Mexico Register on December 1, 2008. See Exhibit G, attached.
- 7. <u>19.15.3.9.A(4) NMAC</u> requires that the notice be published by posting on the OCD's website not less than 20 days prior to the scheduled hearing date. The application and the original Notice were scanned and posted on the OCD's website on November 12, 2008. The revised Notice was scanned and posted November 19, 2008. See Exhibit H, attached.
- 8. <u>Section 14-4A-4, NMSA 1978</u> provides that prior to the adoption of a proposed rule that may have an adverse effect on small business, an agency shall provide a copy of the proposed rule to the commission at the same time as persons who have requested advance notice of rulemaking. I mailed a copy of the application and a copy of the original notice to the Small Business Regulatory Commission on November 12, 2008. On November 19, 2008, I mailed a copy of the revised Notice to the Small Business Regulatory Commission. See Exhibits I and J, attached.

CASE 14255: This case concerns the proposed amendment of 19.15.39 NMAC to add two new sections setting out special provisions for Santa Fe County and the Galisteo Basin, which extends into portions of San Miguel and Sandoval Counties. Proposed section 19.15.39.9 NMAC requires operators to obtain the approval of the Oil Conservation Division (Division) for an exploration and development plan prior to drilling, reentering or deepening a well in Santa Fe County or the Galisteo Basin, and requires the operator to renew the plan every five years. The operator will be required to operate the wells covered by the plan in accordance with the plan's requirements until the plan is specifically replaced by a special pool order. The proposed rule sets out the process for obtaining, amending, renewing and replacing exploration and development plans. Proposed section 19.15.39.10 NMAC sets out conditions that will be applied to applications for permits to drill, re-enter or deepen a well covered by an exploration and development plan. These conditions will apply unless the operator's approved exploration and development plan recognizes an exception.

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

Dear Commissioners:

The Oil Conservation Division (OCD) is proposing to amend 19.15.39 NMAC to add two new sections setting out provisions applicable to Santa Fe County and the Galisteo Basin. The new material is to be codified at 19.15.39.9 and 19.15.39.10 NMAC. Because the amendment may impact small business, the OCD is providing the Small Business Regulatory Advisory Commission with a copy of its application and the proposed amendments, pursuant to NMSA 1978, Section 14-4A-4.

Proposed section 19.15.39.9 NMAC requires operators to obtain OCD approval for an exploration and development plan prior to drilling, re-entering or deepening a well in Santa Fe County or the Galisteo Basin, and requires the operator to renew the plan every five years. The operator will be required to operate the wells covered by the plan in accordance with the plan's requirements until the plan is specifically replaced by a special pool order. The proposed rule sets out the process for obtaining, amending, renewing and replacing an exploration and development plan.

Proposed section 19.15.39.10 NMAC sets out conditions that will be applied to applications for permits to drill, re-enter or deepen a well covered by an exploration and development plan. These conditions will apply unless the operator's approved exploration and development plan recognizes an exception.

The Oil Conservation Commission has scheduled the hearing on the OCD's application for **December 11**, 2008. Notices of recommended modifications must be received by **November 24**, 2008; written comments on the proposed amendment and pre-hearing statements must be received by **December 3**, 2008.
