Policy 6.1.1: ~~Encourage~~ **REQUIRE** sustainable development and "green" construction and operating techniques for oil and gas development, including, but not limited to, the following:

MUST ADOPT *The Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Green Building Rating System™ encourages and accelerates global adoption of sustainable green building and development practices through the creation and implementation of universally understood and accepted tools and performance criteria.*

- a) Consideration of the cumulative impact of all actions
- b) Creating the least impact possible on a site
- c) Constructing facilities, to the extent feasible, using existing infrastructure
- d) Recycling of all waste products
- e) Minimization of emissions through the use of "green" technology
- f) Use of best management practices
- g) Alternatives to gas generators, such as solar or wind
- h) Use of recycled materials
- i) The development of a sustainability plan (analyzing current practices for ways to reduce waste, reuse and recycle equipment, facilities and materials)
