IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATION OF MEWBOURNE OIL COMPANY FOR COMPULSORY POOLING, EDDY COUNTY, NEW MEXICO.

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APPLICATION

MEWBOURNE OIL COMPANY ("Mewbourne"), through its undersigned attorneys; flereby makes application pursuant to the provisions of N.M. Stat Ann. § 70-2-17 (1978), for an order pooling all mineral interests from the surface to the base of the Yeso formation in all formations and pools in the NE/4 NE/4 of Section 7, Township 20 South, Range 25 East, NMPM, Eddy County, New Mexico, and in support of its application states:

1. Mewbourne is a working interest owner in the NE/4 NE/4 of said Section 7 and has the right to drill thereon.

2. Mewbourne proposed to dedicate the above-referenced spacing and proration unit to its West Draw "7" A Federal Well No. 1 to be drilled as a wildcat oil well at a standard location 1250 feet from the North Line and 330 feet from the East Line (Unit A) of said Section 7 to a depth sufficient to evaluate Yeso formation at an estimated total depth of 4,000 feet beneath the surface .

3. Mewbourne has sought and been unable to obtain a voluntary agreement for the development of these lands from certain interest owners in the subject spacing unit who are identified on Exhibit A to this application.

4. The pooling of interests in this spacing unit will avoid the drilling of unnecessary wells, will prevent waste and will protect correlative rights.

5. For Mewbourne to obtain its just and fair share of the oil and gas underlying the subject lands, all mineral interests should be pooled and Mewbourne Oil Company should be designated the operator of this spacing unit and the well to be drilled thereon.

WHEREFORE, Mewbourne Oil Company requests that this application be set for hearing before an Examiner of the Oil Conservation Division on March 18, 2010, and, after notice and hearing as required by law, the Division enter its order:

- A. pooling all mineral interests in the subject spacing and proration units,
- B. designating Mewbourne Oil Company operator of the unit and the well to be drilled thereon,

- C. authorizing Mewbourne to recover its costs of drilling, equipping and completing the well,
- D. approving the actual operating charges and costs of supervision while drilling and after completion, together with a provision adjusting the rates pursuant to the COPAS Accounting Procedures, and
- E. imposing a 200% penalty for the risk assumed by Mewbourne in drilling and completing the well against any working interest owner who does not voluntarily participate in the well.
