- 1 MR. FESMIRE: At this time, we're
- 2 going to come out of executive session in Case Number
- 3 14521. The Commission has met in executive session
- 4 this morning. The only case that we discussed was
- 5 this case, Number 14521, and that this is the only
- 6 decision we discussed.
- 7 The decision of the Commission is
- 8 that the application should be denied. The reasons
- 9 being that the disposal method proposed by Williams
- 10 is not on-site burial, and the permit application is,
- 11 therefore, denied. A proposal like Williams' should
- 12 be considered under 19-15-17-15 as a general
- 13 exception or alternative closure method.
- 14 Williams' pit is a temporary pit
- under the definition of 19-15-17-4-I. Temporary pits
- 16 are specifically exempted from the definition of
- 17 surface waste management facility at
- 18 19-15-2-7-5-11-C. The pit, therefore, is not
- 19 governed by Rule 36 and is governed by Rule 17,
- including the exceptions under 19-15-17-15.
- 21 The issue of whether burial of the
- 22 contents at an off-site temporary pit may be exempted
- 23 under Rule 17 depends on the specifics of the
- 24 proposal and whether they meet the criteria under
- 25 19-15-17-15-A-1 or 19-15-17-15-B. It is not

- 1 foreclosed from meeting the criteria solely because
- 2 it is an off-site pit. We understand the legitimate
- 3 concern about operators using an exception process to
- 4 avoid Rule 36.
- 5 We remind everyone, however, of two
- 6 things: OCD has the discretion in determining
- 7 whether a proposal is truly an exception under
- 8 19-15-17-15 and the authority to prevent its abuse.
- 9 The second thing, 19-15-17-11-F-10 limits the volume
- 10 of a temporary pit to ten-acre feet, including
- 11 freeboard.
- We have directed counsel to draft an
- order to this effect. We are not sure when that
- 14 order will be available, but the decision is that the
- 15 application will be denied. Any questions?
- 16 MR. SMITH: Is there any point in
- 17 trying to get findings out of the lawyers on that?
- MS. MUNDS-DRY: No.
- MS. MACQUESTEN: No.
- 20 MR. SMITH: I think maybe I asked the
- 21 wrong bunch.
- 22 MR. FESMIRE: Or certainly at the
- 23 wrong time. Well, not seeing any questions, is there
- 24 anything further before the Commission? At this
- 25 time, we will adjourn in Case Number 14521 pending an

order, which hopefully will be available at the next 1 regularly scheduled Commission meeting but probably not the 12th. 3 MR. SMITH: What is the next 4 regularly scheduled --5 6 MS. DAVIDSON: September 9. MR. SMITH: Well, that is actually 7 possible. 8 9 MR. FESMIRE: With that, the chair will accept a motion from the Commission to adjourn. 10 MR. OLSON: So moved. 11 12 MS. BAILEY: Second. MR. FESMIRE: All of those in favor 13 signify by saying aye. 14 15 MR. OLSON: Aye. 16 MS. BAILEY: Aye. 17 MR. FESMIRE: Aye. At this time, the 18 Commission meeting in Case Number 14521 is adjourned. 19 20 21 22 23 24

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
