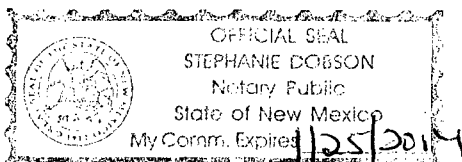

Mewbourne Oil Company has filed an application with the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division seeking an order approving a 160-acre non-standard oil spacing and proration unit (project area) in the Bone Springs formation comprised of the N/2S/2 of Section 30, Township 18, South Range 30, East NMPM, Eddy County, New Mexico. Applicant further seeks the pooling of all mineral interests in the Bone Springs formation underlying the N/2S/2 of Section 30 to form a non-standard 160-acre oil spacing and proration unit (project area) for all pools or formations developed on 40-acre spacing within that vertical extent. The units are to be dedicated to the Bradley 30- Fed. Com. Well No. 1, a horizontal well with a surface location in the NW/4SW/4 of Section 29, and a terminus in the NW/4SW/4 of Section 30. The producing interval of the wellbore will be wholly within the N/2S/2 of Section 30. Also to be considered will be the cost of drilling and completing the well and the allocation of the cost thereof, as well as actual operating costs and charges for supervision, designation of applicant as operator of the well, and a 200% charge for the risk involved in drilling and completing the well. The application is scheduled to be heard at 8:15 a.m. on Thursday, March 3, 2011, at the Division's offices at 1220 South St. Francis Drive, Santa Fe, New Mexico 87505. As an interest owner in the well unit, you have the right to enter an appearance and participate in the case. Failure to appear will preclude you from contesting this matter at a later date. The attorney for applicant is James Bruce, P.O. Box 1056, Santa Fe, New Mexico 87504. The unit is located approximately 7-1/2 miles south of Loco Hills, New Mexico.
