WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 9:05 a.m.:

CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Well, good morning. This is our first meeting here of the Oil Conservation Commission, and you're actually seeing a new Commission, since we were reappointed. It's the old Commission, but it's also a new Commission. So I'll introduce it for those of you that didn't know the old Commission.

On my left is Commissioner Bill Weiss, the appointee of the Secretary of Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources, a long-standing, highly respected petroleum engineer.

And on my right is Commissioner Gary Carlson, the representative of the Commissioner of Public Lands, State of New Mexico, who is the appointee of the Commissioner, and Gary holds a law degree as well as an engineering degree and has had many years' experience in the oil and gas industry.

If you don't know me, my name is Bill LeMay. I'm the Director of the Oil Conservation Division and have been recently reappointed as that Director. And according to statute, the Director sits on the Oil Conservation Commission.

So we are the three comprising the Oil Conservation Commission.

This is our first meeting of the year, and to give you a schedule of what we plan in the next day and a half, the way that will go is, this morning we're going to hold our proration hearing, which is held twice a year.

I'm assuming that will go till 11:00, 11:30, whatever.

And depending on when that breaks we'll have lunch in the afternoon, reconvening at either 1:00 or 1:30, to engage in what will be our first meeting where we as Commissioners will listen to an agenda that's really presented by you all, the public and the industry. And you'll bring to us -- I call it industry, public, talks; Commission listens. You'll bring to us the concerns that you have on changes you'd like to see made in the rules and policy, procedures, some way that we can better serve the industry and the public and the State in our capacity as engineers.

The Oil Conservation Commission is required -- or it's our duty to enact the laws -- or not the laws but the rules and regulations that govern activities in the oil patch, and the Division implements those rules and regulations. So we are the body that would like to hear your concerns.

And then those of you that are here for a case, Case 11,048 will be dismissed, but Case 10,994 will be heard tomorrow morning.
