BY THE DIVISION:

This cause came on for hearing at 8:15 a.m. on September 15, 1994, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner Michael E. Stogner.

NOW, on this 19th day of September, 1994, the Division Director, having considered the record and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS THAT:

- (1) Due public notice having been given as required by law, the Division has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.
- (2) By Order No. R-9769-A, as amended, the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission granted authority to C & C Landfarm, Inc. to construct and operate a commercial "landfarm" facility for the remediation of non-hazardous hydrocarbon contaminated soils utilizing an enhanced biodegradation process on a site located in the SW/4 NE/4 (Unit G) of Section 3, Township 20 South, Range 37 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico.
- (3) C & C Landfarm, Inc. seeks to expand said facility by including an adjoining 40-acre tract comprising the NW/4 NE/4 (Unit B) of said Section 3.
- (4) Prior to the time of the hearing, the Division's Environmental Bureau on its own motion requested this matter be dismissed at this time.
 - (5) Dismissal of this case should therefore be granted.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

Case No. 11086 is hereby dismissed.
