APPLICATION

NEARBURG EXPLORATION COMPANY, through its undersigned attorneys, hereby makes application pursuant to the provisions of N.M.Stat.Ann. § 70-2-17, (1978), for an order pooling all mineral interests in the N/2 NW/4 of Section 13, Township 17 South, Range 37 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico, and for an unorthodox bottomhole well location, and in support thereof states:

- 1. Applicant owns a working interest in the N/2 NW/4 of Section 13, and Applicant has the right to drill thereon.
- 2. Applicant proposes to dedicate the above-referenced spacing or proration unit to its Shriner No. 2 Well to be drilled to an unorthodox bottomhole location 300 feet from the North line and 2130 feet from the West line in the N/2 NW/4 of said Section 13, to a depth sufficient to test any and all formations from the surface to the base of the Strawn formation, South Humble City-Strawn Pool.
 - 3. Applicant has sought and been unable to obtain either voluntary agreement for

pooling or farmout from certain interest owners in the N/2 NW/4 of said Section 13.

4. Said pooling of interests will avoid the drilling of unnecessary wells, will

prevent waste and will protect correlative rights.

5. In order to permit the Applicant to obtain its just and fair share of the oil and

gas underlying the subject lands, all mineral interests should be pooled, and Nearburg

exploration Company should be designated the operator of the well to be drilled.

WHEREFORE, Applicant prays that this application be set for hearing before an

Examiner of the Oil Conservation Division on May 4, 1995 and, after notice and hearing as

required by law, the Division enter its order pooling the lands, including provisions for

Applicant to recover its costs of drilling, equipping and completing the well, its costs of

supervision while drilling and after completion, including overhead charges, and imposing

a risk factor for the risk assumed by the Applicant in drilling, completing and equipping the

well and approving an unorthodox oil well bottomhole location 330 feet from the North line

and 2130 feet from the West line of said Section 13.
