10	Q. Mr. Stogner, will you please state your name,
11	your employer and your position with your employer for the
12	record?
13	A. My name is Michael E. Stogner. I'm employed with
14	the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division here in Santa Fe
15	as a petroleum engineer.
16	Q. And have you had an opportunity to testify before
17	this Division before and had your qualifications accepted?
18	A. Yes, I have.
19	MR. CARROLL: Mr. Examiner, are the witness's
20	qualifications acceptable?
21	EXAMINER CATANACH: Yes, they are.
22	Q. (By Mr. Carroll) Mr. Stogner, are you prepared
23	to make recommendations today concerning the nomenclature
24	concerning certain pools in Chaves and Eddy Counties, New
25	Mexico, and in Rio Arriba, San Juan and Sandoval Counties,

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1	New Mexico?
2	A. Yes, I am.
3	Q. And how are your recommendations set forth?
4	A. In Case 11,299 I have an exhibit marked Number 1,
5	which is a set of plats showing the extensions, the
6	creations or contractions of pools, and the abolishment.
7	And in Case 11,300 I have two exhibits, 1 being
8	somewhat of a summary of the different wells involved in
9	the different pools, and Exhibit Number 2 is a listing of
10	plats showing the extensions, contractions, creations and
11	such, in that format.
12	Q. Just let me get this straight. In case 11,299
13	you have one exhibit?
14	A. Yes.
15	Q. And in Case 11,300 you have two exhibits?
16	A. Two exhibits, yes.
17	Q. And have you had an opportunity to review Exhibit
18	1 in Case 11,299 and Exhibits 1 and 2 in 11,300 and compare
19	them to the docket that's been prepared for today's
20	hearing, and did you determine if there's any discrepancy
21	between the docket and the exhibits?
22	A. I have reviewed them, and there are no
23	discrepancies.
24	I would like to point out in Case Number 11,299,
25	we have changed a little bit whenever we have a contraction
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1	or an abolishment. Usually we have listed those first and
2	then put any extensions which cover those properties
3	somewhere within the listing.
4	What we're doing now is, if there's an
5	abolishment or a contraction and then a corresponding
6	extension, we're listing them in somewhat of an order so
7	they're able to be entered into the ONGARD system easier,
8	and also they can be tracked a little bit easier.
9	Take, for instance, the abolishment of the East
10	Dagger Draw-Upper Pennsylvanian and the extension of the
11	North Dagger Draw-Upper Penn, and then following that you
12	have the contraction of the East Avalon-Bone Spring Pool
13	and the extension of the Burton Flat-Bone Spring Associated
14	Pool in Eddy County.
15	Q. And was Exhibit Number 1 in Case Number 11,299
16	and Exhibits 1 and 2 in Case 11,300 prepared by the Oil
17	Conservation Division in its ordinary course of business?
18	A. Yes, they were prepared by the geologist in each
19	of the respective offices in the normal course of duties.
20	MR. CARROLL: Mr. Examiner, I have nothing
21	further of this witness, and I would offer what has been
22	marked Exhibit Number 1 in Case 11,299 and Exhibits 1 and 2
23	in Case 11,300 into the record.
24	EXAMINER CATANACH: Exhibit Number 1 in 11,299
25	and Exhibit Number 1 and 2 in Case Number 11,300 will be

admitted as evidence in this case. 1 2 Mr. Stogner, that's probably a very helpful and 3 useful thing for the people that are entering into ONGARD. 4 Do you know where that -- Did you originate that idea? 5 THE WITNESS: Why, no, I didn't. I believe that was originated by one of our understaff here, Ms. Florene б Davidson --7 EXAMINER CATANACH: 8 I see. THE WITNESS: -- and also in consulting with some 9 of the ONGARD people involved in the new computerization of 10 our records. 11 EXAMINER CATANACH: I see. 12 Well, Ms. Davidson should be commended for her efforts. 13 14 THE WITNESS: Thank you. EXAMINER CATANACH: Is there anything further? 15 16 MR.
