### APPLICATION

Comes now MARATHON OIL COMPANY, by and through its attorneys, KELLAHIN and KELLAHIN, and applies to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division for approval to drill an oil well at an unorthodox oil well location 2310 feet from the South line and 1310 feet from the East line (Unit I) of Section 33, Township 17 South, Range 35 East, NMPM. Said well is to be dedicated to a standard 40-acre oil spacing and proration unit consisting of the NE/4SE/4 of said Section 33 for all 40-acre spaced oil production including but not limited to the Blinebry formation and the East Vacuum Drinkard Pool.

In support thereof, Applicant states:

- 1. Applicant, Marathon Oil Company ("Marathon"), is the operator of both the NE/4SE/4 and the NW/4SE/4 of Section 33, Township 17 South, Range 35 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico.
- 2. Marathon proposes to drill the subject well an at unorthodox location 2310 feet FSL and 1310 feet FEL (Unit I) of section 33 and to dedicate the NE/4SE/4 to said well.
- 3. The subject well is within one mile of the current boundary of the East Vacuum Drinkard Pool and therefore is subject to Division's statewide Rules and Regulations which provide that an oil well shall be located not closer than 330 feet to the outerboundary of a 40-acre spacing unit consisting of a single governmental quarter-quarter section.

- 4. A 3-D seismic survey indicates that the optimum location in the NE/4SE/4 of Section 33 is at an unorthodox location 10 feet from the common boundary with the NW/4SE/4 of Section 33.
- 5. Marathon seeks approval of that unorthodox well location so that it can drill its proposed well to test for oil production from the Blinebry formation and/or Drinkard formation.
- 6. The well only encroaches towards a spacing unit (NW/4SE/4) which has the same ownership as the subject 40-acre spacing unit.
- 7. Approval of the application will afford the applicant the opportunity to produce its just and equitable share of the hydrocarbons in this portion of the Drinkard formation and/or Blinebry formation and will otherwise prevent waste and protect correlative rights.
- 8. In accordance with Division Rule 1207, notification is being sent to those parties listed on Exhibit "A".

WHEREFORE, Applicant requests that, after notice and hearing, this Application be approved as requested.
