

Dear Mr. Stogner:

This letter confirms our meeting on Thursday of last week during which I asked for your advice with respect to the information that my client has discovered in drilling the well which was the subject matter of its application.

As I indicated to you, in the course of drilling the well, my client has confirmed that the north/south trending fault is further west than previously believed. As a consequence, my client wants to come back uphole and whipstock the well base to a bottomhole location which could cross the section line.

Your opinion was that given the significant faulting in the area and uniform working and royalty interest, Sullivan should drill the well to achieve production without being restricted by an OCD order which probably has to be amended as a result of drilling efforts. In addition, you would delay issuance of an order until production was obtained or a dry hole was drilled. If production was obtained, then we would amend our application to conform to the bottom hole location and production unit configuration. If a dry hole is ultimately the result, then the application would be dismissed.
