This matter came on for hearing before the Oil Conservation Commission on Thursday December 14th, 1995, at the New Mexico Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department, Porter Hall, 2040 South Pacheco, Santa Fe, New Mexico, Steven T. Brenner, Certified Court Reporter No. 7 for the State of New Mexico.

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WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at
9:00 a.m.:
CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Call the meeting to order.
This is the Oil Conservation Commission Hearing.
My name is Bill LeMay, Chairman of the Commission. On my
left is Commissioner Bill Weiss; on my right, Commissioner
Jami Bailey representing the Commissioner of Public Lands,
State of New Mexico.
I might announce we'll have a little different
procedure this morning. You'll notice on your docket that
there will be a short business meeting. We'll take those
items on the docket concerning final action on Rule 711 and
also on the docket awaiting Rule 104, which we're going
to have final action on it; that will be delayed and
also approval of the minutes.
So we're getting more organized, I guess you'd
say, or it's going to be more in terms of how other
meetings are conducted.
We will start with the business meeting and the
approval of the minutes which you have before you, I think,
copies of the minutes.
Is there a motion to approve the minutes?
COMMISSIONER WEISS: Yeah, I move to approve the
minutes.
CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Okay, thank you.

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1	Will you second, Commissioner Bailey?
2	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I second.
3	CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Okay, moved and seconded. All
4	in favor say "aye".
5	Aye.
6	COMMISSIONER WEISS: Aye.
7	CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Opposed, "nay".
8	The minutes of the meeting, November 9th, have
9	been approved.
10	The next item of business concerns Case Number
11	11,351. It's been advertised as awaiting final action. We
12	will not take any more testimony today on that case, and we
13	will postpone final action on that matter until January
14	18th. I just might mention for those of you concerned and
15	my fellow Commissioners, that there were portions of that
16	that I think we initially addressed incorrectly.
17	Example: The first meeting we had, Bill Morrow
18	presented some testimony concerning the definition of
19	wildcat wells in the northwest part of the state, having
20	those wells classified as wildcat if they're two or three
21	miles from known production. The initial draft did not
22	carry that recommendation. We want to revisit the draft to
23	incorporate that.
24	And some discussion on that by fellow
25	Commissioners Is there any comment that you have on that

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1	part of it, Commissioner Bailey, or
2	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: No.
3	CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Or Commissioner Weiss?
4	COMMISSIONER WEISS: I have no
5	CHAIRMAN LEMAY: No comment?
6	Other parts of the draft that was submitted
7	contained unorthodox spacing units, the approval at the
8	District level. I think there was an assumption there that
9	these would be approvals based on variations in the size of
10	the units.
11	We have approved some units, unorthodox units
12	that were rather complex. They were maybe half the size of
13	the initial unit. And this was a conservation issue, the
14	idea being that this well was going to be plugged, rather
15	than try and form a new unit to perforate maybe a gas sand
16	before abandonment, an unorthodox unit would be approved
17	administratively.
18	Those type of administrative approvals on
19	unorthodox locations would probably be a higher level of
20	concern and notification than just approval of unorthodox
21	sorry, not location, unorthodox size of proration units.
22	That would be a matter of course because of lots or
23	surveys.
24	So that particular that classification of
25	unorthodox spacing units was going to be revisited. And

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1	because of those two major concerns, we want to look at
2	some other drafts that Any of you have anything, maybe,
3	to add or say concerning Rule 104? Commissioner Weiss?
4	COMMISSIONER WEISS: No.
5	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: No.
6	CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Commissioner Bailey? No?
7	So we will postpone final action on that until
8	the January 18th meeting.
9	You have before you the order on Rule 711. This
10	was signed by all Commissioners at the last meeting of the
11	Commission. Unfortunately, we've found some omissions in
12	that, mainly pertaining to the bonding section. We felt
13	that it was strictly a mechanical omission, but the final
14	draft we signed did not carry those. We felt it was too
15	much of an omission to do a nunc pro tunc order on that, so
16	what we did is make those changes in the order, and we will
17	sign or I recommend that we sign the Rule 711 as a
18	replacement order today.
19	So you have in front of you a Rule 711, and wish
20	to comment on that?
21	Commissioner Weiss?
22	COMMISSIONER WEISS: Not at this time.
23	CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Okay, Commissioner Bailey?
24	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Not at this time.
25	CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Do you wish to look over the

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1	Rule 711 prior to signing, or are you ready to take final
2	action on the replacement?
3	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I would like it finalized.
4	CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Sure.
5	COMMISSIONER WEISS: Yeah, I don't have a version
6	of 711.
7	CHAIRMAN LEMAY: You don't have a version of 711?
8	We have The final order is there. Okay.
9	Well, why don't we take that and maybe take it up
10	a little later for final action? Would that be acceptable?
11	COMMISSIONER WEISS: This is where we left out
12	the
13	CHAIRMAN LEMAY: The bonding.
14	COMMISSIONER WEISS: The bonding, yeah, okay.
15	It was a lot better the way we had it before we
16	left it out. Take you quite a bit of time to read this.
17	But we've seen this before.
18	CHAIRMAN LEMAY: We have seen it before.
19	COMMISSIONER WEISS: Yeah, this is all familiar.
20	Yeah, that looks good. I'll sign that.
21	CHAIRMAN LEMAY: You can sign it later. Do you
22	approve of final action being taken on that document?
23	COMMISSIONER WEISS: Yeah, I approve final action
24	on this document.
25	CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Did you want to, Commissioner

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1	Bailey, or at a break
2	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: At a break would be fine.
3	CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Okay. We'll revisit that after
4	a break. Commissioner Bailey would like to read it and
5	make sure it's acceptable.

7	(The following proceedings had at 10:33 a.m.)
8	CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Before we continue, as part of
9	the record I would just like to say that final action is
10	now complete on Rule 711 with all three Commissioners
11	agreeing to the order as presented, and it will be signed
12	today.
