

TRANSCRIPT OF PROCEEDINGS

BEFORE: WILLIAM J. LEMAY, CHAIRMAN WILLIAM WEISS, COMMISSIONER JAMI BAILEY, COMMISSIONER

> August 3rd, 1995 Santa Fe, New Mexico

This matter came on for hearing before the Oil Conservation Commission on Thursday, August 3rd, 1995, at the New Mexico Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department, Porter Hall, 2040 South Pacheco, Santa Fe, New Mexico, Steven T. Brenner, Certified Court Reporter No. 7 for the State of New Mexico.

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WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 1 9:04 a.m.: 2 3 CHAIRMAN LEMAY: We're going to take a couple 4 cases here before proration. They'll be very quick, but 5 those of you waiting around for some of these, we can 6 dispose of them rather quickly, I think. 7 Cases Number -- We'll call Case 11,233, which is 8 9 the Application of Nearburg Exploration Company for compulsory pooling, Eddy County, New Mexico, and a 10 companion case, Case 11,234, which is the Application of 11 12 Yates Petroleum Corporation for compulsory pooling. 13 I understand that these cases have been dismissed. 14 Is that -- Is there anyone that argues with that 15 16 or... Those cases, then, at the request of the 17 18 Applicants, shall be dismissed. * * * 19 20 CHAIRMAN LEMAY: And we will call Case 10,907, 21 which is the matter called by the Oil Conservation Division 22 to amend Rules 1111, 1112 and 1115 of its General Rules and 23 Regulations. This pertains to the filing of forms, Forms 24 C-111, C-112 and C-115, respectively. 25

This case has been continued under temporary rules in the past four -- six months. And our intent is to continue it for another six months pending implementation, final implementation, of the ONGARD system.

These dates have been extended, filing dates have been extended, and the information we've received is favorable to these extended dates.

However, the matter of fines and all, we think, are inappropriate to bring up at this time, since we're still in the process of getting the bugs out.

So does anyone have anything to say concerning Case 10,907?

If not, Case 10,907 shall be continued six months to the hearing which will be six months from August.

CHAIRMAN LEMAY: And we shall call Case 11,352, which is a motion -- a case called by the Oil Conservation Division to amend Rule 116 of its General Rules and Regulations.

This particular rule pertains to notification of fires, breaks, leaks, spills and blowouts. It's -- To review is necessary because we need to update that rule and also comply with the peer review of the Interstate Oil and Gas Compact Commission.

At this time we will be appointing a committee, representing industry, the public, the environmental community, to review those rules and regulations and come up with some recommendations to the Commission.

As in the past, that committee will present some proposed rules, which in turn will be sent out to all operators, all interested parties, for comment and also to be the markup document for the Commission in its deliberations on those rules.

So we do not plan to take any testimony.

However, if there's any of you that have any questions as to our procedure in that, be happy to entertain those questions now.

There's a sign-up sheet in the back, on the back table, so those of you that wish to participate in this committee, please sign up your name, company, telephone number, and I will appoint a committee. And hopefully we'll have enough volunteers that we'll have a well-rounded committee representative of the industry, and also of the public and of the environmental community too. So...

Are there any questions or comments concerning Case 11,352?

If not, we will continue that case for six months to give the committee time to do their work, deliberations and come back with some recommendations.

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In the event that six-month time frame is not
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     sufficient, we can always extend that.
