

WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 9:10 a.m.:

CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Well, good morning, and glad to see such a good turnout, considering the weather out there.

This is the Oil Conservation Commission monthly meeting. My name is Bill LeMay, Chairman of the Commission. To my left, Commissioner Bill Weiss. To my right, Commissioner Jami Bailey representing the Commissioner of Public Lands, State of New Mexico.

And we've got a pretty interesting program, I think, because this is the Commission Listens yearly event where you all produce some suggestions to us on what you'd like to see us do.

In the back there, I've got a sheet there, if you haven't seen any. It's a handout concerning last year's results, basically, of what you recommended that we undertake. And I'll go over this when we get to that portion of the meeting, to kind of show you that we're adopting most of what you come up with. So, you know, from that point of view I think it's important that you all continue this dialogue with us, because your ideas are good. And as shown by our action, we're adopting almost everything that makes sense.

Let's begin by conducting some business here. First, I have the minutes of the previous meeting. Is

there a motion to accept the minutes? 1 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I move we accept. 2 COMMISSIONER WEISS: I second. 3 CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Second. It's moved and 4 5 seconded. All in favor say "aye". COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Aye. 6 7 COMMISSIONER WEISS: Aye. CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Opposed? Fortunately, all three 8 9 of us agree. * * * 10 Also of note here is -- Today I signed the Open 11 12 Meetings Resolution, which conforms with the State Open 13 Meetings Act, whereby we give notices to all our meetings and conduct all our meetings according to the sunshine 14 We do that every year, and every year we adopt the 15 16 Open Meeting Resolution to conform with the Open Meetings 17 Act. So let the record show that's been done. 18 The other item of business was taking final 19 action on Case Number 11,352, Order Number 10,766, which is 20 an Application by the Oil Conservation Division to amend 21 Rule 116 of its General Rules and Regulations, pertaining 22 to leaks, spills, blowouts. 23 And as a companion case, separate, but testimony 24

was consolidated for the purpose of testimony was Case

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Number 11,352, Order Number 10,766, again the Application of the Oil Conservation Division to amend leaks and spills, but also to adopt a separate rule which, in turn, brought over the -- the rules and regulations at the Water Quality Control Commission over here -- I gave the wrong case.

That case is 11,635, and Order Number 10,767. What that did is just establish methods and standards for prevention and abatement of water pollution that's associated with oilfield operations.

In essence, that particular order amended Rule 7 of our Rules and Regulations and also adopted a new Rule 19, which was the standards, the Water Quality Control Commission -- that has brought those standards over here to the Oil Conservation Division and Commission so we have jurisdiction over that particular rule.

And I'd like to first turn it over to

Commissioner Weiss, anything he'd have to say about the -both orders.

COMMISSIONER WEISS: I have one comment. I was pleased to see that we recognize risk now, rather than -In my mind, that says that there's a difference between spilling the tank water, a tank load of produced water at Taos along the river, and in Jal. So I think that's in the order.

CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Fine. Commissioner Bailey, you

had some comments or statements that you'd like to make? 1 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I'm particularly pleased 2 that there is one reporting form the industry can use for 3 reporting to the OCD, to the State Land Office and to the 4 I believe that consolidation and lack of duplicative 5 BLM. 6 paperwork will be helpful. 7 CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Good. And you were favorably impressed with the order and your intention to sign it? 8 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I intend to sign the order. 9 CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Commissioner Weiss, is that also 10 your intent? 11 Yes, sign the order. COMMISSIONER WEISS: 12 CHAIRMAN LEMAY: As it is mine. And there again, 13 I think because there was such a good cooperative effort 14 that industry provided, and the public and the 15 environmental community, I think it's another example of 16 how we like to engage in our rule-making where there is 17 input. 18 19 Now, everyone isn't going to get what they want, that's not the case. But what happened is, there's enough 20 input and there's enough information there, there's enough 21 consensus that we think we've arrived at a -- you know, 22 pretty good rules. We took about 7, Rule 119 and 116. 23 So 24 there again, the congratulations go out to you all who 25 participated in that effort, along with the staff of the

OCD. 1 And it also is my intent to sign the order too. 2 So let the record show that final action has been taken at 3 this meeting on those two cases. 4 Okay, is there any other business that you can 5 think of that needs to be performed? 6 7 Okay, we'll get into the docket per se. 8 First, I think we can take some 9 CHAIRMAN LEMAY: of the dismissals and extensions. 10 Call Case Number 10,994, which is the Application 11 of Phillips Petroleum to reopen de novo Case Number 10,994. 12 It's been indicated to us by counsel for the case 13 that this case, without prejudice, should be dismissed. 14 Is there any objection to dismissal of this case? 15 If not, let the record show 10,994 has been 16 dismissed. 17 18 CHAIRMAN LEMAY: And we can call Case Number 19 11,515, which is the matter called by the Oil Conservation 20 Division on its own to permit the operator, Woosley Oil 21 Company, and American Employees Insurance Company and other 22 23 interested parties to show cause why wells should not be plugged. 24

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There's been a motion to extend that case to our

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March 19th hearing. Is there any objection to that
