1	WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at
2	9:05 a.m.:
3	CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Good morning. This is the Oil
4	Conservation Commission hearing. My name is Bill LeMay,
5	Chairman of the Commission. To my left is Commissioner
6	Bill Weiss, to my right Commissioner Jami Carlson,
7	representing the Commissioner of Public Lands, State of New
8	Mexico What did I say?
9	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: "Jami Carlson".
10	CHAIRMAN LEMAY: We used to have a Commissioner
11	Carlson. I was just combining Commissioners with that
12	statement, I guess. The former Commissioner Carlson is no
13	longer with the Department; he's with LFC? Yeah, that's
14	right, he's with LFC. So
15	Commissioner Jami Bailey, excuse me, representing
16	the Commissioner of Public Lands.
17	Carol Leach is our general counsel for the
18	Department, and also counsel for the Commission.
19	And we shall begin by calling We're taking
20	this a little bit out of order I'll say why because
21	one of them, we're just going to appoint a committee, and
22	that is Case Number 11,391.
23	So at this time we will call Case Number 11,391,
24	which is the matter called by the Oil Conservation
25	Commission to enact new rules and regulations relating to

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1	the NORMs, naturally occurring radioactivity, the NORM
2	standards, enacted by the Environmental Department, and
3	these rules and regulations, OCD rules and regulations,
4	will address the disposal of NORMs.
5	So rather than calling for appearances in this
6	case, what I'd like to do is ask for volunteers for that
7	committee, leave the record open, certainly, 30 days for
8	those volunteers, to send word to me that they'd like to be
9	on the Committee.
10	Any of you here that would like to be on the
11	Committee, there's a tablet in the back, please sign up.
12	And I will appoint a committee and they'll look
13	into disposal options and rules and regulations involving
14	disposal down wellbores, we're talking about, of NORMs
15	occurring in the oil patch.
16	Are there any questions or comments concerning
17	these proposed rules and regs?
18	The background on them, as I remember, is, the
19	Environmental Department has held hearings and has
20	wrestled, I guess you could say, with these standards for
21	well over a year, maybe two years. Is that pretty
22	ROGER ANDERSON: Over two.
23	CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Four years?
24	ROGER ANDERSON: Over two.
25	CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Over two years, yeah.
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They have come up with rules and regulations, as 1 far as jurisdiction over radioactivity, the Environmental 2 Department has that jurisdiction. 3 However, when you look at the practical aspects 4 of dealing with this NORM in the oil patch and economical 5 disposal of that NORM, it involves generally the disposal 6 down wellbores, otherwise it becomes prohibitively 7 expensive if you're trying to look at other forms of 8 disposal, shipping it off in drums to Utah or whatever, 9 sending it up in spacecrafts or -- I mean, it can really 10 get outlandish. 11 So what we're doing is trying to get some 12 economical options for operators to dispose of this 13 material, and that's what this committee is all about. 14 So -- Yeah? 15 KEN MARSH: What's the time frame to have this 16 17 completed? CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Well, I was going to do it in 18 19 six months. What do you think about that? I see one person shaking their head. 20 I think it's going to take some time to look at 21 I'm talking about bringing a report back within 22 it all. five months, sending that report out as draft rules and 23 regulations to industry, like we tend to do, and then 24 holding the hearing on it, using that document as a markup 25

document.

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2	And that committee will be balanced. We need
3	some representation from the environmental community as
4	well as representation from industry, meaning operators and
5	those that would be in charge of the disposal operations.
6	So we Like we try and do on all committees, we want to
7	get a balance on that committee, so it produces a balanced
8	document and we don't get one element that hasn't been
9	heard from, because we'd much rather incorporate all those
10	elements, so to speak, that have any interest or
11	stakeholders in the issue, into the committee. Then we
12	don't get, at the Commission hearing, people that haven't
13	been heard from or haven't been represented.
14	KEN MARSH: I might say that in the process of
15	putting these NORM regulations together, there were
16	environmentalists and public members on this committee that
17	have already had a lot of input into this.
18	CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Yeah.
19	KEN MARSH: So it's not like you're starting from
20	scratch
21	CHAIRMAN LEMAY: No.
22	KEN MARSH: about addressing the public, but
23	So it's an issue that shouldn't be real take a lot of
24	time to do, because they're all aware of it.
25	CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Yeah. Any other questions or

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1	comments concerning Case Number 11,391?
2	(Off the record)
3	CHAIRMAN LEMAY: We don't have an agenda yet, but
4	we do meet once a month. So at this point in time we will
5	schedule the Case Number 11,391 for the April, 1996,
6	docket. That will give some lead time in appointing the
7	Committee, give them It takes a month to get to the
8	Committee appointed, because I don't see the people here
9	necessarily that would comprise the whole committee. So
10	we're going to have to go out and spread the word in
11	industry and make sure that they make their intentions to
12	be on the Committee known to me by submitting a letter.
13	And then that will give a month to appoint the
14	committee and then five months from that date to get the
15	report in and then that month to circulate it to industry
16	for comment, and then that brings us to the April docket.
17	So this case will be continued, Case Number
18	11,391 will be continued to the April hearing date, April,
19	1996, hearing date.
