Dear Mr. Quinn.

This letter serves to memorialize our telephone conversation of October 17, 1995 wherein I committed to you verbally that Central Resources, Inc. ("Central") will agree to farm out certain lands to Medallion Production Company ("Medallion") under the following general terms:

- 1. All of Central's Operating Rights, insofar and only insofar as Central is capable of delivering such rights to Medallion, in the above-referenced lands, to a depth of 9,200 feet or adequate to test the Pennsylvanian Morrow formation.
- 2. Central will deliver a net revenue interest lease of 75.0% to Medallion, retaining an overriding royalty interest amounting to the difference between 25.0% and existing burdens, proportionately reduced.
- 3. Central will have the right, but not the obligation, at payout to convert its overriding royalty interest to a 25.0% working interest, proportionately reduced.
- 4. Medallion must establish production of hydrocarbons in paying quantities for a consecutive period of not less than 90 days to earn assignment, without warranty of title, from the surface to the depth described in #1 hereinabove.
- 5. If commercial hydrocarbon production is established. Central and Medallion will execute a mutually-acceptable Joint Operating Agreement in a timely manner.

Central will complete a formal farmout agreement and forward it to Medallion for execution, which agreement will supersede this letter.

Neither this letter, nor the forthcoming farmout agreement, obligates Central in any way to cure any title defects on behalf of Medallion. Central's intent is to seek reassignment of its operating rights from Matador Petroleum, who owes Central such a reassignment by virtue of the prior agreement between Matador and Central (which granted Matador assignment of such operating rights in return for specific performance, i.e. continuously

drilling on certain lands). Central will not extend its agreement with Matador.

A copy of this letter will be forwarded via fax to the New Mexico Oil and Gas Commission to indicate that Central has complied with Medallion's request to farmout or participate in the drilling of a Morrow well. In the event this does become an issue, please note that Central was not permitted 30 days to make its election in response to Medallion's Authority for Expenditure whether or not to join the well as stipulated in the governing Joint Operating Agreement.

Please note that Central has changed its address as shown in the letterhead and update your records to reflect this change.
