APPLICATION

MARALO, INC., through its undersigned attorneys, hereby makes application pursuant to the provisions of N.M.Stat.Ann. § 70-2-17, (1978), for an order pooling all mineral interests in the Wolfcamp formation in the N/2 NE/4 of Section 20, Township 13 South, Range 38 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico, and in support thereof states:

- 1. Applicant is the owner of working interest in the N/2 NE/4 of said Section 20, and applicant has the right to drill thereon.
- 2. Applicant proposes to dedicate the above-referenced spacing or proration unit to its Lowe "20" No. 1 Well which was drilled at an unorthodox oil well location 350 feet from the North line and 1550 feet from the East line in the N/2 NE/4 of said Section 20, and completed in the Wolfcamp formation. This location was approved by Division Order No. R-10403 entered on June 26, 1995.
- 3. Maralo has sought the creation of a new pool for production of oil from the Wolfcamp formation and the promulgation of temporary Special Pool Rules and Regulations therefor including provisions for 80-acre spacing. The Lowe "20" No. 2 Well will be

governed by these rules. (See Case 11409 heard on October 19, 1995).

4. Applicant has sought and been unable to obtain either voluntary agreement for

pooling or farmout from certain interest owners in the N/2 NE/4 of said Section 20.

4. Said pooling of interests will prevent waste and will protect correlative rights.

5. In order to permit the Applicant to obtain its just and fair share of the oil and

gas underlying the subject lands, all mineral interests should be pooled, and Applicant should

be designated the operator of the well to be drilled.

WHEREFORE, Applicant prays that this application be set for hearing before an

examiner of the Oil Conservation Division on November 16, 1995 and, after notice and

hearing as required by law, the Division enter its order pooling the lands, including

provisions for Applicant to recover its costs of supervision of the well, including overhead

charges, and imposing a risk factor for the risk assumed by the Applicant in drilling,

completing and equipping the well.
